Information Background and Rationale

For your consideration is a zone change from RR-2 to C-2. According to the applicant, the purpose for the zone change will be for a tenant to open a small car sales lot to sell classic trucks and some cars and horse trailers. The lot is less than 3 quarters of an acre and building a structure will be costly because of EPA standards for septic. There is question as to whether Mr. Gabaldon will be repairing vehicles on site. There is an elementary school directly across the subject property and there is commercial zoned property to the north.

Packets were handed out for department reviews on July 1, 2011. Code enforcement stated that a building will need to be permitted if one is to be constructed. Also, there are no code violations on the subject property. The Public Works Department has no issues. The Sheriff's Department has no issues. The Fire Department has no issues but needs to be contacted prior to any occupancy and opening a facility of inspection. The Rural Addressor will not address a site without a building or a home.

The Planning and Zoning board heard the request in a public meeting on July 20, 2011 and voted 5-0 to recommend approval of the zone change. The Planning and Zoning Commission found:

The proposed change is consistent with the goals, policies and any other applicable provisions of the comprehensive plan;

The proposed change is appropriate considering the surrounding land uses, the density and pattern of development in the area

The County Commission heard the request in a public meeting on September 14, 2011. The Commission asked Mr. Gabaldon if he will be repairing vehicles on the site to which Mr. Gabaldon stated he will not be repairing, washing or doing in maintenance on the subject property. No one stood for or against the zone change request.

DIRECTING THAT THE VALENCIA COUNTY HOSPITAL MILL LEVY NOT BE MADE FOR TAX YEAR 2011

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners met in a regularly scheduled meeting on Wednesday, September 21, 2011, at 9:30 a.m. in the Valencia County Administration Building 444 Luna Avenue, Los Lunas, New Mexico 87031; and,

WHEREAS, Section 4-37-1 *et seq*. NMSA 1978 provides that counties may adopt those resolutions and ordinances, not inconsistent with statutory or constitutional limitations placed on counties, to discharge those powers necessary and proper to provide for the safety, preserve the health, promote the prosperity and improve the morals, order, comfort and convenience of the county and its inhabitants; and,

WHEREAS, at the November 7, 2006 General Election, the County submitted the question of the imposition of a Mill Levy of 2.75 mills to finance the cost of operating, maintaining or providing for a hospital/24 hour emergency healthcare facility to the registered qualified electors of Valencia County as authorized by Section 4-28B-1 *et seq.*, NMSA 1978 (the "Hospital Funding Act"); and,

WHEREAS, in said election, the voters approved the imposition of the Mill Levy by a vote of 14,245 in favor to 4,438 opposed; and,

WHEREAS, July 16, 2008 the Board of County Commissioners entered into a contract ("Contract") with Valencia Health Commons, a New Mexico non-profit corporation ("VHC"), to transfer the Mill Levy funds from the County to VHC for operation and maintenance of a hospital following VHC's receipt of a Certificate of Substantial Completion of the Hospital Project within thirty-six (36) months of the effective date of the Contract; and,

WHEREAS, on April 21, 2011 the Board of County Commissioners extended the deadline for VHC to receive a Certificate of Substantial Completion by 20 months; and,

WHEREAS, as of the date of this resolution, the Board of County Commissioners has provided Valencia Health Commons notice of termination of the Health Services Contract pursuant to Section 4.4(A); and,

WHEREAS, the contract with VHC originally anticipated transferring only 3 years of mill levy funds collected to VHC upon the receipt of a Certificate of Substantial Completion; and,

WHEREAS, the mill levy fund has accumulated an amount that far exceeds the original 3 year amount; and,

WHEREAS, the country is experiencing an economic recession and the mill levy is a significant tax burden paid by the property owners of the County which may be suspended when it is not needed.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to NMSA 1978, Section 4-48B-15(D) (1995) the Board of County Commissioners of Valencia County directs that the mill levy shall not be made for tax year 2011 since sufficient funds for operation and maintenance of a hospital are currently available.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Valencia County that the Board understands that foregoing the collection of the mill levy for a tax year will not extend the mill levy but instead will reduce the total years of collection from 8 years to 7 years.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Valencia County that staff is hereby directed to deliver a copy of this resolution to VHC upon its execution comply with the notice requirements of sections 3.4 and 4.3 of the Contract.
