- 1) The meeting was called to order by Chairman Eaton at 3:35 P.M.
- 2) Dan Zolnier led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 3) Approval of Agenda

Commissioner Aragon moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Romero. Motion passed 3-0. Commissioner Aguilar and Commissioner Andersen were absent for the vote.

DISCUSSION (NON-ACTION) ITEM(S):

4) Qualification and Selection Process for County Manager. BOCC

Mr. Swingle stated that a recent revision was done on the County Manager's job description. The revision was made on the second page of the job description under minimum education and experience requirements; on the second bullet the wording "executive management in government" was added. A series of questions have been developed for the interview process that is strictly related to hiring a professional manager. There are a total of fifteen questions for the interview process; an assessment center will be set up where the candidate will answer two questions. One question is dealing with the finances and revenues of the county and what the candidate would consider to be a comprehensive approach, the second question deals with illegal dumping and abatement issues within the county. Chairman Eaton asked HR Director Dan Zolnier how broad the job advertisement went in the last search for a County Manager. Mr. Zolnier replied that it went into the Albuquerque Journal, the local newspaper, the NMAC website, the county website and possibly onto Career Builders.

Commissioner Andersen arrived at the meeting.

Commissioner Andersen sincerely recommended that the interview questions should be kept by Mr. Zolnier and the initial screening team and not be made public. The interview process should be exceedingly fair to all applicants. Mr. Swingle stated that the HR department is now ready to start the job advertisement process. Commissioner Andersen asked who would be doing the initial screening of the applications. Mr. Zolnier replied that he would be the one to screen the applications and remove the ones that don't even remotely qualify, he would then share the balance of the applications with the committee and if requested share the rejected applicants as well. Commissioner Andersen asked if the interview team would be all five commissioners. Mr. Zolnier replied it would be up to the commissioners if they wanted to participate in the selection committee. Commissioner Andersen suggested that she would also like Mr. Zolnier and at least one of the gentlemen from legal counsel be present on the committee as well. Chairman Eaton believes that all of the commissioners would like to be involved in the selection process of a new County Manager. Commissioner Andersen stated that she believes it's important that all are included because they need to find someone whom they can rely on and trust and we won't know that if we are not part of the interview process. Commissioner Andersen and Chairman Eaton expressed their thanks to Mr. Swingle for the work he has accomplished here in the county. Chairman Eaton went on to say that he believes the Mr. Swingle established a relationship that has been long needed between county administration and the employees of the county.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Norbert Schueller- Mr. Schuller asked if the final interviews with the final candidates will be open to the public.

Jim Ricky- Mr. Ricky commented that Mr. Swingle and his staff have done an impressive job; his concern is that when the committee is considering candidates if the chosen person is a local person and is determined to have connections to one or more of the commissioners. The candidate should not in the public's mind be associated to any of the commissioners, because he and a lot of other people would be very suspicious if that did happen.

- 1) The meeting was called to order by Chairman Eaton at 5:01 P.M.
- 2) Lilly McNabb led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 3) Approval of Agenda

Commissioner Aragon moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Aguilar. Motion carried unanimously.

4) Approval of Minutes: August 7, 2013-Business Meeting Commissioner Romero moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Andersen. Motion carried unanimously.

August 21, 2013-Public Hearing

Commissioner Aguilar moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Andersen. Motion carried unanimously.

PRESENTATION(S)

5) Proclamation supporting Literacy Week September 8-14, 2013. Valencia County Literacy Council.

Jill Oglesby Director for the Valencia County Literacy Council read the Proclamation declaring September 8-14, 2013 Literacy Week in Valencia county.

Commissioner Aguilar moved for approval of the proclamation. Seconded by Commissioner Andersen. Motion carried unanimously. (See Exhibit A)

6) Older American's Program Status Report. Lilly McNabb, OPA Advisory Council Chairperson.

Jose Campos went over a report that was submitted to the Rio Metro Agency on Aging. Mr. Campos mentioned that congregate meals had gone from 25,566 since 2007 to 49,894 presently. Homebound meals had gone up to almost 75,000 which is a 21% increase. The amount of funding request that they have submitted to the legislature for this year is \$65,000. In the first 2 months of this fiscal year the OAP program has served 2,000 more meals then last year, they are on track to serve 10,000 more meals than last year. Last year's transportation numbers were at 13,500. September 16th is Senior Day at the NM State Fair and the program is taking some seniors up to the fair to enjoy the day. Wayne Gallegos who is Vice-Chair of the OPA Advisory Council reported that for the 2014 Capital outlay they had requested \$1.2 million. The biggest request was for the Fred Luna Senior Center expansion. They also requested some paved parking for the vehicles in Belen and also an upgrade to the Belen Center kitchen, where all the meals for Meals on Wheels are made. They also requested 4 handicapped vans and some meal delivery trucks as well as repairs for the building in Meadowlake. Ms. McNabb thanked Michael Jaramillo, who works for the Village of Los Luna's for bringing back Senior Olympics to Valencia County. She also said that there will be a public meeting on September 10th for older persons to participate in the planning and operation of community-based services for their benefit. Mr. Campos commented that Valencia County has one of the most progressive programs in the state. Mr. Jaramillo said that he enjoys working with Mr. Campos, Mr. Gallegos and Ms. McNabb; they are extremely energetic and willing to get things done.

DISCUSSION (NON-ACTION) ITEM(S):

7) Commissioners. Committees and Reports.

Commissioner Aragon reported that last week he had been invited by the Governor of Isleta to attend the 400th year celebration at St. Augustine Church. It was an awesome celebration, with a great turnout and Commissioner Aragon stated that he was lucky to be a part of that celebration.

Mr. Swingle commented that this was his last meeting in Valencia County and he would like to recognize the county staff for doing an outstanding job over the last year. The county has very good and talented staff and he believes the county is in good hands.

ACTION ITEM(S)

8) Consideration to accept Resolution 2013-34 "New Mexico Association of Counties Legislative Priorities" Commissioner Andersen/Tasia Young

Tasia Young with the NM Association of Counties and Clyde Young, San Juan County Assessor and chairman of the County Assessors Affiliate presented the 7 legislative priorities of the NMAC. They are as follows:

- 1. Property Tax Equity.
- 2. Non-residential sales disclosure.
- 3. Notice of liens.
- 4. Medicaid benefits suspension for detainees.
- 5. Detention GRT-proposing adding a third and fourth one-sixteenth.
- 6. Delinquent property tax collections.
- 7. Delinquent property tax list.

Commission Andersen moved for approval of the resolution. Seconded by Commissioner Aguilar. Motion carried unanimously.

County Clerk Peggy Carabajal announced Resolution 2013-34. (See Exhibit B)

9) Consideration to approve funding for the Los Lunas High School Jr. ROTC program in the amount of \$500.00. *Commissioner Andersen*

Commissioner Andersen stated that the legal team has determined that the commission can give a monetary donation to the high school for the Jr. ROTC program. Commissioner Andersen moved for approval.

Commissioner Aragon asked how the commission will determine what other programs get approved if we get request after request from other programs. Commissioner Andersen replied that each request would need to be evaluated on its own. When the JR. ROTC was at a previous meeting they pointed out what they do to support various functions that go on within the county.

Chairman Eaton seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Eaton stated that the commission would weigh each individual request, that this approval doesn't serve as a blanket to say that the commission will approve every single request. The commission will weigh each request as to the value it brings to the county.

10) Submission of name to the Governor to Fill the House District 50 vacancy. *BOCC* Chairman Eaton asked if there had been a deadline issued for submitting a name to the Governor. Mr. Swingle replied that to his understanding that there is no real hurry regarding this issue. Commissioner Romero commented that he had been approached by someone who is interested and that he would like to submit a name. Commissioner Aguilar said that she had received a call from Pam Cordova, who lives in Rio Communities, and suggested that Ms. Cordova meet with Commissioner Romero. Commissioner Romero commented that he did meet with Ms. Cordova but that he had made a commitment prior to Ms. Cordova.

Commissioner Romero said he would like to submit Vickie Perea's name for submission to the Governor. Seconded by Commissioner Aragon.

Ms. Perea thanked Commissioner Romero for submitting her name and she gave a brief history of her background. Including that she was a former Administrator for the City of Albuquerque where she managed over \$759 million for the cities capital improvement program. Ms. Perea retired from that position, bringing with her a wealth of experience. Ms. Perea was also a member of the Albuquerque City Council where she was unanimously elected President of the city council. Commissioner Aragon commented that he had met Ms. Perea while he was running for office and the amount of ethic and work that she had put into her campaign was inspiring to him and helped him to better his own campaign in a short amount of time. Commissioner Aragon is confident that Ms. Perea will do an awesome job. Chairman Eaton allowed the public time to speak. Mary Lee Serna asked the commission to please submit Ms. Cordova's name for the vacancy. Bob Gostischa asked if tonight's meeting was the end of anyone having their name submitted

for the vacancy. Chairman Eaton replied that if the board approves a name tonight then the book will be closed for submitting a name to the Governor. Sue Moran said that it would be nice if the commission had gone to the Mayor and council of Rio Communities for suggestions and that if the commission was interviewing people to ask them if they supported the incorporation of Rio Communities. Pam Cordova commented that she has sent a formal letter and resume to the commissioners. Ms. Cordova then gave a brief overview of her resume including that she is a resident of Rio Communities and is currently active in the Rio Communities Association and was in full support of their incorporation, she has also contributed to their fundraising efforts. Ms. Cordova was a public school teacher and also worked for Bernalillo County Parks and Rec where she managed the Los Padillas Community Center. While at the center she was able to double the participation and the revenues. Ms. Cordova stated that she is very dedicated and believes in what she does and gives it her very best. She is confident that she would please and make Valencia County proud if she were selected to fill the vacancy. Mike Wood commented that it's good that we have two people that want to volunteer for the position. But to him one certainly outshines the other; a woman that can spend so much money in the millions and control it is the candidate that should be chosen.

Chairman Eaton called for the vote regarding Ms. Perea's name for submission to the Governor. Motion passed 4-0. Chairman Eaton abstained from voting.

Ms. Perea thanked the commission for their vote of confidence and should the Governor select her you will have a representative that will work extremely hard.

11) Consideration to approve the creation of a budget adjustment resolution to create the position of Fire Captain. *Fire Chief Gonzales*.

Mr. Gonzales stated that in July the ISO department had issued some new fire service requirements requiring all fire services within the nation have a fire prevention, fire education, fire investigation and fire inspection program. Mr. Gonzales would like another person in the leadership program to oversee the day to day operations and to be a liaison to the Fire Marshall's Office as well as to the EMS. Mr. Gonzales would like to promote from within the department, as a lot of our firefighters have been out in the field 5 years and more. He would like them to continue with Valencia County and not seek employment elsewhere. Commissioner Aguilar asked Mr. Telles where the money will come from as this is an unbudgeted item. Mr. Telles replied that he thinks it is clear where the county stands as far as the finances go, this would require a budget adjustment to allow this position to take place. He thinks it's up to the discretion of the commission to decide if we're going to make the budget adjustment or not. Mr. Gonzales commented that he fears that if this does not happen that the county will regress into higher numbers on our ISO ratings.

Commissioner Aguilar moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Andersen. Motion carried unanimously.

12) Consideration to publish the title and general summary of Tome/Adelino Community Plan in a newspaper of general circulation for two weeks. *Jacobo Martinez*

Peter Lupsha, Chair of the Tome-Adelino Community Advisory Council reported that the group has completed a draft of the Tome-Adelino Community Plan. He went on to highlight some of the things that the group has been able to accomplish in a short period of time. Commissioner Andersen and Chairman Eaton commended the group for their extensive work that was put into the plan. Commissioner Aguilar stated that she had read the plan and that there are some items that did concern her. She would like to hold off on this until the attorneys have had time to review the plan and talk to the commissioners about it. She believes it is a very informative document but she just wants to make sure that as a legislative body the commissioners have legal input on the plan. Mr. Martinez said that the group has come together and has worked very hard, as the moratorium was set for 6 months, and set a deadline to achieve the goals they have set. So hopefully they can realize their vision for the future within that 6 months. Mr. Martinez went on to say that he would like to move the process forward knowing that the moratorium will be ending soon. Commissioner Andersen asked the question to the attorneys if they could look at the plan while it is being published prior to the public hearing, that is set for October, so the process will not be slowed down. Attorney Pato replied that yes, absolutely they would have time to review it. Mr. Martinez went on to explain that what is to be published is only the title and summary of the plan, the document is a draft that can be amended as we move towards a public hearing. Attorney Pato commented that the point of publishing is to solicit public comment, the document will be changed. This is not the ultimate document that will be passed. Mr. Martinez stated the reason for publishing is to make people aware of the plan and the upcoming public hearing in October.

Commissioner Andersen moved for approval of publication. Seconded by Chairman Eaton. Motion carried unanimously.

13) Consideration to accept Resolution 2013-35 for benefits for Chief Deputies. *Bruce Swingle*

Mr. Swingle stated that the current county practice is to allow appointed officials such as the Assessors, Clerk and Treasurer's chief deputy's and the Sheriff's undersheriff and executive assistant to accrue sick and annual leave. These positions are authorized by statute and work at the pleasure of the elected official and therefore accrual of leave is not necessary. We've had previous instances that when they leave office they've accumulated this large amount of money that the county has to compensate them for. This resolution is to put an end to that practice.

Commissioner Andersen moved for approval. Seconded by Chairman Eaton. Motion passed 4-1. Commissioner Romero voted no.

County Clerk Peggy Carabajal announced Resolution 2013-35. (See Exhibit C)

14) Consideration to approve contract for New Day Juvenile Program FY 14 in the amount of \$34,481.00. *Cynthia Ferrari*

Commissioner Aguilar moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Aragon. Motion carried unanimously. (See Exhibit D)

15) Consideration to approve contract for Boy scouts ScOutreach program in the amount of \$9,700.00 for FY14. *Cynthia Ferrari*

Commissioner Andersen moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Aragon. Motion carried unanimously. (See Exhibit E)

16) Consideration to approve contract for Big Brothers Big Sisters of Central New Mexico in the amount of \$31,000.00 for FY14. *Cynthia Ferrari*Commissioner Aragon moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Romero. Motion

17) Consideration to approve a JPA between Valencia County and Rio Communities for continuation of services. *Bruce Swingle*

Mr. Swingle said that the city of Rio Communities has requested continuation of county services until they have sufficient funding to become self-sufficient and self-reliant. The commission met with the Rio Communities council and it was determined that they wanted staff to work with Rio Communities and develop an agreement of some type. Once this JPA was published we were notified by Rio Communities that they would like some changes made to the JPA. On page 2 items D and E as well as section 3A under obligations they would like removed. Rio Communities is requesting a JPA similar to the one that the county entered into with Peralta when they incorporated. Attorney Nance commented that what is currently drafted basically says that Rio Communities will provide insurance to Valencia County for the activities that we are undertaking on their behalf. Currently we have our own insurance but our insurance won't necessarily cover working in a municipality on a municipalities behalf. The Peralta JPA that was previously adopted said that the county would provide Peralta with the services and instead of Peralta covering the county, Peralta would reimburse the county at a later time when it is determined how much the county's insurance premiums went up. I believe this is what Rio Communities is asking for at this time. Mr. Swingle said the only issue he has with that is the insurance is a onetime fee but the potential increase would be over a 3-5 year period depending on the type of insurance. Commissioner Andersen asked if the attorneys had a reason as to why Rio Communities wanted to take out paragraphs D & E. Attorney Nance replied that by removing those items it would mean that the county would not provide nuisance abatement or animal control. And he's not sure if that's the intent of Rio Communities but that's what removal would do. Chairman Eaton said that were looking at a document and considering changes but he's concerned if these changes have yet been formally brought before the Rio Communities Council. Rio Communities Mayor Gwinn commented that they had met with the NM Municipal League and they had reviewed the JPA and wanted it somewhat the same as Peralta's JPA. Mayor Gwinn went on to say that the council had been talking among themselves and felt that the previously mentioned items could be removed from the JPA. Commissioner Andersen commented that the county would welcome not having to provide animal control or nuisance abatement but that the commission and the county have learned some things since Peralta was incorporated and that is one of the reasons that there are some differences here in this JPA. Mr. Swingle stated that if Rio Communities compensates the county for what actual costs are that is fair, if it's just what we determine next year what the cost increase was that's just one of three to five years that we'll experience that cost increase. There is no

way to actually determine what the actually costs may be. Commissioner Andersen stated that she doesn't think the language that is currently in the JPA for 3A is what we want. It needs to be spelled out more on how the county is going to be compensated for its costs. Commissioner Andersen moved to table to JPA until it can be re-written. Seconded by Chairman Eaton.

Attorney Nance asked for clarification regarding if the commission was interested in moving forward with a proposal where they would reimburse the county for its increased insurance premiums or a proposal where Rio Communities would insure the county. Chairman Eaton stated that if Rio Communities has insurance with the Municipal League that we should continue with the language in the JPA that is currently before us. He's hesitant to pull it out and having the county inherit the full liability of coverage. Commissioner Aguilar commented that looking at this document we're not ready to sign it tonight. There are just too many questions and she would like more information to be able to make a better informed decision. Commissioner Andersen recommended that a new draft first be approved by the City Council before it comes back to the commission for consideration. Mayor Gwinn stated that the insurance person from the Municipal League said that he would work with the county to clarify any language in the document. And that the city has been insured through the Municipal League since July 1st. Attorney Nance pointed out to Mayor Gwinn that basically the city is covered but the question is whether or not the Municipal League would extend the insurance coverage to cover the county pursuant to this agreement. Mayor Gwinn replied that the Municipal League has said that it would be a negotiable thing at this point in time.

Chairman Eaton called for the vote on Commissioner Andersen's motion and his second to table this item. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Romero suggested that since Rio Communities is in his district he could attend the meetings and keep the commission informed. Valencia County residents Richard Chavez and Mike Wood provided their thoughts on the JPA.

18) Consideration to approve revision of Purchasing Policy by Raising Small Purchase Limits to correlate with the New Mexico Procurement code to include efficiency and cost savings. *Mike Vinyard*

Mr. Vinyard stated that this revision would raise the small purchase limit to match the state Procurement Code, as back in July the limits were raised.

Commissioner Andersen moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Aguilar. Motion carried unanimously.

19) Consideration to award Contract No. VCB-FY14-004 for the Production and Mailing of Tax bills and Delinquent Tax Notices. *Michael Vinyard*.

Commissioner Aguilar moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Andersen. Motion carried unanimously. (See Exhibit G)

20) Consideration to approve Resolution 2013-36 budget adjustments for Juvenile Justice Service Programs. *Nick Telles*

Commissioner Aguilar moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Andersen. Motion carried unanimously.

21) Approval of Financial/Payroll warrants. Nick Telles

Commissioner Andersen moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Aguilar. Motion carried unanimously. (See Exhibit I,J,K,L)

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Norbert Schuller- Mr. Schuller commented that Mr. Swingle has been by far the best and most professional County Manager that he has personally seen since living here in Valencia County. He will be one tough act to follow, he believes that Mr. Swingle brought about the highest level of professionalism that will be hard to follow and that Valencia County's loss is McKinley County's gain. Vaya con dios mi amigo, god speed and prayers go with you on your new adventure.

Dee Miramontes-Ms. Miramontes commented that she is a resident of Meadowlake and for the past 3 months she has been fighting the sheriff and Gary Hall and the rest of the time she is fighting off drug dealers. She said that she can't get any help from the sheriff's department and she doesn't know where else to turn. She knows the word out there is

that she's a crazy women but she is not, she knows what she is talking about. She has attempted to meet with the sheriff on several occasions but a meeting has never been set up. She believes the people of Meadowlake deserve better than the riff raff and the drug dealers that want her and others out of Meadowlake.

Bob Gostischa- Mr. Gosticha commented that Mr. Swingle will be sorely missed and he wishes all the luck to his replacement.

Mike Wood- Mr. Wood commented that Mr. Swingle is a good man and he will definitely be missed. He stated that his biggest concern is that the Village of Los Lunas' attorney filed a lawsuit against the commission and the county as well as the City of Belen and its city council. And that its taxpayer money that the commission and the county use to represent themselves and that offends him. Mr. Wood also said the he believes that there is corruption going on within the commission.

Eugene Pickett-Mr. Pickett stated that he has been here through many county managers. He commented that Mr. Swingle and him might not have always agreed but that Mr. Swingle did definitely set the bar high. Hope was reinstilled in the employees of the county. He brought elected officials and department heads together even when they didn't want to, and that's not an easy job. It's a major accomplishment. Mr. Pickett said that we will feel the loss of Mr. Swingle but that he has left us with a tremendous avenue to move forward with and that he had given the county employees something to believe in.

Mary Wood- Ms. Wood commented that every year her and her husband make a budget and abide by that budget and do not spend anything that has not been budgeted for. And the next year they make their budget adjustments for that year and don't try to find the money. Tonight the commission has spent close to \$100,000 of unbudgeted money, stating you could find it and that is only tonight what about the rest of the year. It appears that if you want something you'll find the money. Maybe that's one of the reasons the budget has been out of whack for a long time.

Sue Moran- Ms. Moran commented that Mr. Swingle has been the best county manager that she has experienced in her 10 years of living here. She thinks the commission can set the same example. They can support, set standards, abide by rules and enforce the rules. Ms. Moran also welcomed Commissioner Aragon and said that the choices and decisions that he makes will also affect her in the unincorporated area. She will hold him to the same standard the she holds her own commissioner.

Attorney Nance stated that the matters discussed in executive session were limited to those in the motion for closure and that no final action was taken.

Commissioner Andersen moved for approval of the summary as stated by Attorney Nance. Seconded by Commissioner Aragon. Roll call vote. Commissioner Romero voted yes. Commissioner Andersen voted yes. Commissioner Aragon voted yes. Commissioner Aguilar voted yes. Chairman Eaton voted yes. Motion carried unanimously.
