Big Brothers Big Sisters lost its long-time Outreach Coordinator for Valencia County. We have posted the position and are doing phone interviews with 6 candidates who we will narrow to 3 candidates for in-person interviews. Our plan is to extend an offer before the end April.

In March, we received 4 new volunteer inquiries from Valencia County – two men, two women. We currently have 8 children Ready to Be Matched – 4 girls, 4 boys – which means they have completed their intake, all the need are volunteers with whom to be matched. One Little Sister interview is scheduled for 4/2. We have 26 children who are in the inquiry phase of our program.
