- Ruben Barreras is seeing more wax in the schools.
- Michael Lucero explained what wax was and provide information on how they handle self-harm cases.
- Bart Regerlbrugge would like to see more action from this group.
- Teriesa Mraz would like to see more spiritual support.

- Nancy Sanchez said that this group can work on building those community connections.
- Robert Aguilar suggested give youth cards that they can use.
- Diana Good had 40/120 youth reach out for additional support after a suicide prevention training. They had people available to follow up with youth immediately.
- Los Lunas schools has implemented the STOP IT program that allows youth to report things to administration anonymously.
