- 1) The meeting was called to order by Chairman Holliday at 9:30 A.M.
- 2) Chairman Holliday led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 3) Approval of Agenda

Commissioner Otero-Kirkham moved for approval of the agenda. Seconded by Commissioner Andersen. Motion carried unanimously.

4) Approval of Minutes: June 27, 2012 – Business Meeting July 2, 2012 – Special Meeting (Contract Termination/ No Burn Ordinance) Commissioner Otero-Kirkham moved for approval of the June 27, 2012 Business Meeting. Seconded by Commissioner Romero. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Otero-Kirkham moved for approval of the July 2, 2012 Special Meeting. Seconded by Chairman Holliday. Motion carried unanimously.

DISCUSSION (Non-Action) ITEM(S)

County Manager Bruce Swingle asked the commissioners if any one of them would be interested in serving on the interview panel for the Finance Director position. Both Commissioners Andersen and Otero-Kirkham said they would like to be on the panel.

Commissioner Otero-Kirkham brought up for discussion the memorandum from County Manager Bruce Swingle indicating that apparently Valencia County is paying the Ricco Company on 3-4 printers \$7,615.00 annually without a contract since 1991.

Commissioner Andersen said this re-enforces the importance of an additional purchasing person and would like for the commission to take that action and approve it.

Commissioner Otero-Kirkham said another item brought to light is that there are eight credit cards that amount to about \$100,000.00 a year in expenditures. The county should only have one credit card that is checked out by the department if a purchase needs to be made and then bring back the receipt.

Commissioner Gentry said this is not new, most of these issues have already come to the commission, we've given direction to clean them up but we just haven't followed through. We as the commission need to start keeping an eye things and follow through.

Commissioner Romero said he takes offense to the "we thing." This is the first he's heard of this and if we don't do anything about it, he'll be included in the "we." Let's see if there's any criminal action that needs to be looked at and let's follow through with it. He will be on top of it.

Chairman Holliday said just being part of the commission as he is, you're going to get the blame for it because he's on the board. Chairman Holliday also asked Mr. Swingle could this be a result of each department doing their own thing as each department is unique in their own way on some of these issues and we're going to try and organize it get one shoe that fit's all. Is that possible?

Minutes of July 18, 2012 Regular Business Meeting

Mr. Swingle said the county doesn't have the infrastructure setup, the filing system or the accountability for that particular department, so certain things are farmed out to different individuals and we've basically diluted it to where we're going to get a very inferior product and performance.

The county vehicle fleet is an absolute mess, there are about 270 vehicles that are reported to the insurance and the county doesn't have that many cars. There a lot of vehicles that are completely out of service, they don't need to be insured and the county is paying premiums on vehicles that are not operational. The county fleet in general is in very poor state.

Commissioner Andersen said the memorandum makes a suggestion to hire several additional staff in various places. Will the commission have to take formal action to permit that or what does Mr. Swingle need to get that done?

Mr. Swingle said the key is to keep the commission updated as to what is happening in the county and in the future he will come to the commission when a concrete plan is in place. He will meet with Jacobo Martinez and the shop mechanic to address the fleet management issue. He's not sure if a fleet manager will have to be hired or maybe it'll call for some restructuring.

Commissioner Andersen stated she would like to see action taken on each and every one of these issues and if formal approval is needed on any of these, she would like this brought to the commissions attention at the earliest possible time.

BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS CONVENES AS INDIGENT CLAIMS BOARD

Commissioner Otero-Kirkham moved to convene as the Indigent Claims Board. Seconded by Commissioner Romero. Motion carried unanimously.

5) Consideration of Indigent Report / Appeal – Bruce Swingle / Barbara Baker Ms. Baker presented the Indigent Claims from May 24, 2012 - July 5, 2012 and requested approval of \$99,173.29

Commissioner Andersen moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Romero. Motion carried unanimously. (See Exhibit A)

Ms. Baker presented an appeal for Jesus Estrada in the amount \$1,579.70 and requested approval of \$1,216.37 to be paid to UNM Health Sciences Center.

Commissioner Andersen moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Romero. Motion carried unanimously. (See Exhibit B)

Commissioner Otero-Kirkham asked Ms. Baker since the new 1st Choice here in the county now provides dental services along with a primary care facility, would the county now be working with them rather then sending the prisoners out of Valencia County? Ms. Baker said since returning to work, she has been putting in an extra hour each day to keep up with the work load and get caught up. Commissioner Andersen suggested if an agreement is needed to get this moving maybe someone can help Ms. Baker with that.

BOARD RE-CONVENES AS BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Commissioner Otero-Kirkham moved to re-convene as the Board of County Commissioners. Seconded by Commissioner Andersen. Motion carried unanimously.

6) Consideration to Amend Mr. Martinez's Contract from Public Works Director to Planning and Zoning Director / Bruce Swingle.

Commissioner Andersen motioned to table this until the commission makes a decision whether they're going to issue contracts or not. Seconded by Commissioner Gentry. Motion carried unanimously.

7) Consideration to Approve MOA Raise Increase for Detention Center Officers – Joe Chavez / Bruce Swingle.

Commissioner Otero-Kirkham moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Gentry. Motion carried unanimously. (See Exhibit C)

8) Consideration to Approve MOA Raise Increase for Sheriff's Deputies - Louis Burkhard.

Commissioner Gentry moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Otero-Kirkham. Motion carried unanimously. (See Exhibit D)

8) Consideration to Approve DOJ / COPS Grant and Provide \$11,575 to the Sheriff's General Fund for Matching Portion of the Grant – Louis Burkhard

Valencia County Sheriff Louis Burkhard said the Department of Justice Cops Grant typically has funded 100% of salary and benefits for a period of three years for a deputy

sheriff but changes this year requires a match. They'll pickup 75% of those costs and the county would be responsible for the other 25%. This would be funded for a period of three years and a requirement of the grant is the county maintains that position for the fourth year. Sheriff Burkhard respectfully asks that the \$11,575.00 be added to his budget in order to pickup an additional deputy and also making that a permanent position at the end of the grant period.

Commissioner Otero-Kirkham moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Andersen. Motion carried unanimously.

10) Consideration of 2012-13 County Arterial Program (CAP) Cooperative Agreement – Jacobo Martinez.

Commissioner Andersen said she is very reluctant to sign anything that looks like it might have an illegal road on it and would suggest that the commission table these three items until Mr. Martinez can look into the facts and figure out whether these are legal roads or not. Commissioner Gentry seconded with the suggestion that Commissioner Andersen amend her motion to table this until such time as the legal aspects of this have been worked out by the road department so they can do what they're suppose to have done and it will all be legal. This will take at least two meetings to go through the road viewing and place them on the docket and make them legal.

Commissioner Andersen said if the roads in question are not legal she suggests that the Memorandum of Understanding be amended to remove those and the commission can sign for the rest of them. Motion carried unanimously.

- 11) Consideration of 2012-13 Co-Op (SP Cooperative Agreement Jacobo Martinez Tabled
- 12) Consideration of 2012-13 School Bus Route (SB) Cooperative Agreement Jacobo Martinez.

- 13) Payment to MID-Region Council of Governments for Annual Dues Bruce Swingle County Manager Bruce Swingle said the annual dues are for amount of \$22,043.00. Commissioner Andersen moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Otero-Kirkham. Motion carried unanimously.

14) Clarification of Purchasing Authority for Budgeted Items – Christina Card / Michael Vinyard.

Purchasing Agent Michael Vinyard said there is a need for clarification of the existing policy. The county manager has the approval authority for contracts up to \$10,000.00 which was amended recently. Where he runs into an issue is the fact that every purchase order that this county issues is legally a contract. So if he follows the letter of the law of the policy, every \$2 purchase order that is issued by this county that he signs off on, must go before the manager for his signature as well. This means he will be signing off on each single purchase that the county makes. There is a process that has been in place for quite some time and the general process was that if an item came forward to the purchasing department for approval for a purchase and it was in the approved budget, the purchasing officer signed off on it and that's as far as it went. It then went forward, the purchase order went to the vendor and the product was received. Mr. Vinyard wants to make sure he's complying with the policy and also with the desires and the intent of the commission without bogging down the commission or the manager or the process. Mr. Vinyard is proposing a clarification from the commission that they are okay with him signing off as the purchasing agent for those items that have come forward on a purchase requisition and the purchasing department has certified that the need is valid and is within his or her approved budget regardless of the dollar value. He then will sign off on those and move forward. On the checks and balances in the system, every check that is paid once it's done and every check that is to be issued to pay for these items comes before the commission, so then the commission has the chance to approve it at that point and time.

Commissioner Otero-Kirkham asked if he wanted the commission's approval to sign off on any amount, as long as it represents an item within the budget that the commission previously approved. Yes, was Mr. Vinyards response. Commissioner Otero-Kirkham moved for approval.

County Attorney Dave Pato stated what this agenda item does is to confirm the way these are presently being done. This is not to change the system; this agenda item pertains to budgeted items not brought before the commission. Unbudgeted items up to the \$10,000.00 will go to the county manager and beyond \$10,000.00 will go before the

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County Commission. That's the clarification Mr. Vinyard was looking for; it was not looking in changing the process, just looking for the confirmation of that process to have the verification of the commission to continue what you're doing as long as it's budgeted. Resolution 2012-18 which gave the county manager the \$10,000.00 authority to contract. It didn't address the situation where what if you had a \$12,000.00 purchase order does that purchase order have to come before the commission for permission before we go ahead and get it purchased when it's already been budgeted by the commission. We just want the clarification that you continue doing it the way you've been doing it as long as it's been budgeted. That's all this was to do was to get that clarification of the process the commission wishes to implement.

Mr. Vinyard said the resolution Mr. Pato quoted does not make a distinction between budgeted and unbudgeted items. It simply alludes to all items must come forward. Mr. Pato said that's where the clarification is needed.

Chairman Holliday said all unbudgeted items over \$10.000.00 needs to come to the commission.

Mr. Vinyard said that greatly simplifies the process.

Commissioner Gentry said does that include if it's a \$30,000.00 item and they bill us at the rate of \$10,000.00 per billing. Can that be approved?

Mr. Vinyard said from a purchasing prospective he looks at things at a total dollar value of the contract associated, so from the scenario set forth, he would consider that a \$30,000.00 item that would need to come forward to the commission regardless of how it's broken up for payment.

Commissioner Gentry said so the answer is if the contract as a whole is more then \$10,000.00 it has to come before the commission.

Mr. Vinyard said yes, that would be correct otherwise that would be a breakup of the contract for purposes of getting around the resolution, which is obviously not acceptable. Seconded by Chairman Holliday. Motion carried unanimously.

15) Payment for Share 'n' Care Pharmacy re: Adult Detention – Christina Card / Michael Vinyard.

Purchasing Agent Michael Vinyard said due to a number of misunderstandings going back to last year, we have ended up in a situation where we have one vendor acquiring product from another vendor and the second vendor is then invoicing the county for that product, which are specifically medical supplies for the Adult Detention Center. The county did go out on contract to secure a vendor to provide the medical services but for whatever reason the acquisition of necessary pharmaceuticals and medical supplies was not included in the contract. The contractor began utilizing the contractor that he previously used by county employees, made a decision that wasn't working out well and went out and made an agreement with Share 'n' Care Pharmacy in Belen to make purchase from them without the involvement of the county. This went on for a number of months and did not invoice the county for five months, then a stack of invoices showed up and they wanted a large five figure amount of money for all of these supplies that they had purchased. He went back and asked them to show him the legal mechanism they had to make these purchases and they said that's just the way it was done previously and the way they've continued to do it and they've changed to a vendor that works better. Just as a situation that is not tenable we have to go back and conduct a procurement to put a proper contract in place to allow the legal acquisition of these necessary pharmaceuticals and supplies. However we did accept the supplies and pharmaceuticals, so the county needs to pay them for the supplies that were accepted. Mr. Vinyard is requesting a check to pay Share 'n' Care Pharmacy.

Commissioner Otero-Kirkham asked Mr. Vinyard if he was working on a contract or some type of a process. Mr. Vinyard said yes.

Commissioner Andersen asked Mr. Vinyard, what are we doing in the meantime, allowing this to go on? We have no choice, yes was Mr. Vinyard's response.

Commissioner Andersen moved for approval.

Commissioner Gentry said he has no problem with purchasing from Share 'n' Care Drugs but after the discussion on Item (14) on dividing it up and taking the \$10,000.00 limit and now we have a bill that came in for \$30,000.00 and because we didn't know what to do with it, we issued a check for \$10,000.00 on June 29th in partial payment of the amount due. The above requested payment and two to three subsequent payments that the county manager can approve will allow sufficient time to conduct competitive bidding. So in fact that's exactly what's being done?

Mr. Vinyard said that's exactly right and that is not the way to do it but at this point and time we've been backed into a corner and they have threatened to terminate services which would put the detention center in a bind and working with the county manager they found it best to give them a show of good faith and get them some money in their pocket as they did perform in good faith. You're exactly right and this is not what they want to do and this is what we're trying to get away from but in this case we're backed into a corner.

Commissioner Gentry said what would have been wrong if we weren't going to use this \$10,000.00 limit incrementally, finding this unapproved, unauthorized bill which was totally over an aggregate of \$10,000.00 and had it on the agenda today to pay the bill. It concerns him that a policy was just debated that said we absolutely wouldn't do that and here we're absolutely doing that and we're siding with the manager's authority to pay aggregates in increments of \$10,000.00. This needs to be brought to the commission and let's pay the debt the county owes which should be the way it should have been handled. County Attorney Dave Pato stated the \$10,000.00 was for the interim period until the contract could be put in place. The commission will be approving the county manager's use of that authority and the interim until the contract is in place.

Seconded by Commissioner Otero-Kirkham. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Andersen moved for approval of the summary as stated by counsel. Seconded by Commissioner Otero-Kirkham. Roll call. Commissioner Romero voted yes. Commissioner Otero-Kirkham voted yes. Commissioner Andersen voted yes. Commissioner Gentry voted yes. Chairman Holliday voted yes. Motion carried 5-0.
