5) Extension of Valencia Valley Healthcare contract for inmate medical services. Michael Vinyard

Mr. Vinyard stated that Valencia Valley Healthcare has notified the county that they will not be able to continue service at the current rates they are providing. They are requesting a significant price increase and the current contract will expire on October 1, 2013 so the Purchasing department will be going out to RFP to find a better deal. The county has requested Valencia Valley Healthcare to stay on board temporarily while a new procurement is conducted. Valencia Valley Healthcare has agreed to do that but at a price increase. This extension is necessary to continue the medical care for the inmates at the detention center.

Commissioner Aguilar moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Andersen. Motion carried unanimously. (See exhibit C)

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Norbert Schuller- Mr. Schuller commented that today the commissioners discussed with the legislators the county's wish list, the ICIP. However it requires lots of money to implement all the projects and he is worried about the financial stability of the county. Mr. Schuller suggested two basic ways for the county to increase its revenue. The first option is to higher property taxes and the second is the local option of the county GRT.

VALENCIA COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS RESOLUTION 2013-39

A RESOLUTION Adopting a Multi-Year Infrastructure Capital Improvements Plan for 2015 to 2019

WHEREAS, Valencia County recognizes that the financing of Public Capital Projects has become a major concern in the County, the State of New Mexico and nationally;

WHEREAS, in times of scarce resources, it is necessary to find new financing mechanisms and maximize the use of existing limited resources;

WHEREAS, systematic Capital Improvement planning is an effective tool for governmental entities and their communities to define their development needs, establish priorities and pursue positive actions and strategies to achieve necessary project development; and

WHEREAS, this process contributes to both local and regional efforts in project identification and selection in short and long-range capital planning efforts.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Valencia County Board of County Commissioners that:

- 1. The County adopts the attached Infrastructure Capital Improvements Plan;
- 2. The Plan is intended to be a working document and is the first of many steps toward improving rational, long-range capital planning and budgeting for the County's infrastructure and capital needs; and
- 3. This Resolution supersedes *Resolution 2012-43*, and any other resolutions relating to the Infrastructure Capital Improvements Plan and which are also in conflict with the above provisions of this Resolution.

AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT WITH VALENCIA VALLEY HEALTHCARE

THIS Amendment to the Valencia Valley Healthcare Contract ("CONTRACT") is made as of September 27, 2013, by and between the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF VALENCIA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, a political subdivision of the State of New Mexico ("COUNTY") and VALENCIA VALLEY HEALTHCARE, a New Mexico Corporation located in Albuquerque, New Mexico ("VALENCIA VALLEY HEALTHCARE").

RECITALS:

- A. The COUNTY and VALENCIA FAMILY MEDICINE AND EXPRESS CARE entered into a CONTRACT on September 1, 2010 for the provision of medical and psychiatric management services for the inmates at the Valencia County Detention Center (referred to as the "CONTRACT").
- B. The CONTRACT specifically provides that the terms of the contract may be modified by instrument in writing executed by both the COUNTY and VALENCIA VALLEY HEALTHCARE.
- C. On August 1, 2012, the parties utilized the modification provision to increase the compensation provided under the CONTRACT.
- D. On October 1, 2012, the parties utilized the modification provision to assign the rights and responsibilities under the CONTRACT to VALENCIA VALLEY HEALTHCARE.
- E. The parties desire to once again modify the CONTRACT as provided herein.

 Amendment to Contract with Valencia Valley Healthcare

EXHIBIT C

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. **Incorporation of Recitals.** The foregoing recitals are incorporated by reference as a material part of the CONTRACT as if the same were set out completely in the CONTRACT.
- 2. **Amendment.** The CONTRACT shall be amended as set forth in this instrument, and, except as expressly amended by this instrument, shall remain in full force and effect as written.
- 3. Modifications to the September 1, 2010 CONTRACT and August 1, 2012 and October 1, 2012, AMENDMENTS to CONTRACT.
 - a. The term of the CONTRACT is extended for ninety one (91) days with the last day of the contract term being December 31, 2013.
 - b. The paragraph relating to the Payment for Services is deleted in its entirety and the following paragraph is substituted in its place:

"Payment for Services. The County shall pay to the Contractor in full payment for services satisfactorily performed pursuant to the Scope of Work rendered at a rate of \$25,345.47 per fourteen (14) day period, inclusive of New Mexico Gross Receipts Tax, to be paid every other week upon receipt of a detailed statement of accounting for services performed and expenses incurred hereunder. Periods of performance of less than fourteen (14) days shall be paid on a pro-rated basis. There will be no additional reimbursement for mileage or per diem. Valencía County shall have fourteen (14) days to remit payment to Independent Contractor from the date of submission of the itemized invoice. No

charges shall be billed to the County for any of the following services or items unless prior authorization is obtained from Valencia County:

- Secretarial, word processing, proofreading, filing, office machine attendants, file organization or other clerical services;
- b. Photocopy expenses at more than 10 cents per page;
- c. Computer time;
- d. Local telephone expenses;
- e. Charges related to computer usage, online or Internet related investigation or research;
- f. Local faxes (incoming or outgoing)
- g. Audit letters; and
- Any other expense properly chargeable to overhead or as a capital expense.

"The Independent Contractor shall maintain detailed time records which set forth each service rendered in each matter, the person rendering such service, his/her hourly rate, if any, the time expended in rendering such service and the date such service was rendered. The Independent Contractor shall submit these records along with its billings to the County every other week. The records shall be subject to inspection by the County. The County has the right to audit billings both before and after

payment, and to contest any billing or portion thereof. Payment under this Agreement does not foreclose the County's right to recover excessive or illegal payments.

"The County's fiscal year begins July 1 and ends July 30 of each calendar year. The County may only make payment for services rendered or costs encumbered during a fiscal year. Billings for services performed or costs incurred prior to the close of a fiscal year must be submitted with ample time to allow for payment within that fiscal year."
