- 1) The meeting was called to order by Chairman Eaton at 5:01 P.M.
- 2) Mr. Lawrence Esquibel led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 3) Approval of Agenda

Commissioner Aguilar requested that action item #11 (Open Burn Ordinance) be tabled in order to have more discussion and input about this item. Attorney Nance requested that action item #17 (Appt. Of Hearing Officer) be removed from tonight's agenda.

Commissioner Aragon moved for approval of the agenda with the removal of the 2 requested items. Seconded by Commissioner Andersen. Motion carried unanimously.

4) Approval of Minutes: October 30, 2013- Special Meeting/Workshop Commissioner Aguilar moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Aragon. Motion carried unanimously.

November 6, 2013- Business Meeting

Commissioner Andersen moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Aragon. Motion carried unanimously.

November 12, 2013-Special Meeting

Commissioner Aguilar moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Andersen. Motion carried unanimously.

PRESENTATION(S)

5) Valencia County Emergency Management Flood Issues. Glenda Chavez

Ms. Chavez stated that the county's current submitted costs are at \$81,000 which includes equipment and personnel. She also mentioned that she is pushing to have included in the amount the costs of how much it cost the county to get materials from our pit. The federal declaration tallies should be in by the end of December then it will be the states turn, more then likely the county will be included in the state portion but we don't know exactly the amount that we will be reimbursed. These amounts are for issues dating from September to now, anything before September was not declared a disaster. Ms. Chavez commented that she will forward what she submitted to the state to Mr. Telles.

DISCUSSION (NON-ACTION) ITEM(S):

6) Commissioners, Committees and Reports.

Commissioner Aguilar reported that she had attended a roundtable discussion with Senator Udall, doctors, and the Assistant Director from UNMH Behavioral Health. She said it was a very interesting discussion about mental health and substance abuse and she would like the Director of UNMH to come and give a short presentation at a commission meeting. She is also working with Attorney Pato in regards to how to go about getting the detainees at the jail registered with Medicaid and Medicare where there might be a possibility of charging their medical care to the government.

Chairman Eaton stated that he and Commissioner Aguilar had attended the ribbon cutting for PNM's Renewable Energy Solar Facility near Valencia High school.

Mr. Vinyard invited the commissioners to a "No Turkey Allowed" Thanksgiving potluck that the county staff was having on Friday the 22^{nd} at noon.

Fire Chief Steve Gonzales gave a brief update on the activites of the 911 Board.

Mr. Telles stated that the Animal Control Department had been busy dealing with having had a rabid dog at the shelter.

Ms. Bouska reported that Conejo Transfer Station is back up and running with 1 truck, there may be various closings during the day in order for the truck to transport the full trailer to the dump, but closing notices will be posted on the gate at Conejo.

- 8) Discussion of Valencia County Road Acceptance Ordinance. *Kelly Bouska*Ms. Bouska went over the ordinance process regarding the steps that need to be taken for the county to accept a public road for county maintenance. (See Exhibit A)
- 9) Discussion of Conejo Transfer Station Funding Options. *Kelly Bouska*Ms. Bouska stated that it had been anticipated that Conejo would have been transferred over to Waste Management by this budget cycle; but as of right now it looks like the county will retain ownership of Conejo for the entire fiscal year. Currently the county only has money to fund the transfer station until December 31st of this year. The bottom line is that the county is short \$103,000 to run the transfer station until June 30, 2014. Ms. Bouska and Ms. Schnell presented 5 options for funding the operation of the transfer station. Commissioner Aguilar stated that she would like a workshop scheduled to discuss this issue more. She also asked the attorneys for an update on the Waste Management contract. Attorney Pato replied that it is now in the courts hands to make a ruling. It can take several months to several years, no one really knows how long it might take. (See Exhibit B)

Commissioner Andersen moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Romero. Motion passed 4-0. Commissioner Aguilar was not present for the vote. (See Exhibit C)

Ms. Adame gave a brief background history on the DWI Program. This resolution allows the Village of Los Lunas to act as the fiscal agent for the DWI Program.

Commissioner Andersen moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Aguilar. Motion carried unanimously.

County Clerk Peggy Carabajal announced Resolution 2013-44. (See Exhibit D)

12) Resolution in support of the Village of Los Lunas/Valencia County DWI Program to continue operation of Misdemeanor Compliance Program. *Ginny Adame, DWI Coordinator*

Magistrate Judge Tina Garcia spoke in support of the Misdemeanor Compliance Program. Commissioner Andersen moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Aguilar. Motion carried unanimously.

County Clerk Peggy Carabajal announced Resolution 2013-45 (See Exhibit E)

Commissioner Romero moved for approval of publishing the ordinance. Seconded by Commissioner Aragon.

Commissioner Aguilar asked what would be the costs associated with this ordinance. Attorney Nance replied that there would be no election costs as we are not holding a

special election on this issue. There is no way to quantify the cost for enforcing the ordinance, that is not really a cost that you would be able to calculate or even say that there is going to be any substantial cost. Where there is potential cost is in litigation, that can be anywhere from a \$10,000 deductible if insurance covers this, and I don't think they would, into more substantial amounts. Commissioner Aguilar asked if this ordinance was unconstitutional. Attorney Pato replied that the Board of County Commissioners is statutorily authorized to take the actions that are necessary to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens. The Attorney General has taken the position on this matter that it is unconstitutional and that it is not enforceable, but there are other organizations that would suggest that this is a matter of first impression and that the court has not yet decided whether or not the state has compelling interest in protecting unborn children from pain. This matter has not been decided by a court in New Mexico or the 10th Circuit or by the United States Supreme Court. Commissioner Aguilar stated that she is not saying that she is either for or against the ordinance but she is willing to hear and listen to both sides and will make her decision at the end. Commissioner Andersen stated that her concern with this issue is what the legal ramifications may be for the county if this ordinance is passed. She went on to say that no one wants this thing to be happening but as commissioners we're here to protect the county. Commissioner Aguilar wanted it made clear that this ordinance if passed would be for the unincorporated areas of the county, it would not cover Valencia County as a whole. Chairman Eaton stated that he had studied this issue from many angles. He commented that he believes that this ordinance would not be enforceable and that it would cost the county a whole lot of money and he has difficulty going forward with something that would be such a cost to the county. And going through the process of a public hearing would be difficult and emotional for both sides.

Chairman Eaton called for the vote on Commissioner Romero's motion and Commissioner Aragon's second. Motion passed 3-2. Commissioner Andersen and Chairman Eaton voted no. (See Exhibit F)

15) Consideration of Request for a Zone Change from Rural Residential-2 (RR-2) to Community Commercial (C-2). Jacobo Martinez

Chairman Eaton moved for approval. Seconded by Commissioner Andersen. Motion carried unanimously.

16) Consideration to approve NM Workforce Solutions Educational Training Contracts. *Lawrence Esquibel*

Mr. Esquibel stated that in this contract NM Workforce Solutions would cover half or better of the funding for the training of the IT staff. He believes that by his employees attending these training they will be better prepared to serve the employees of Valencia County.

Commissioner Andersen moved for approval of authorizing Mr. Telles to approve the individual contracts as needed. Seconded by Commissioner Aguilar. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Esquibel reported that the Microsoft licensing issues were taken care of for under \$6,000.

17) Appointment of Hearing Officer for Wisenant Appeal. *Adren Nance* Item tabled.

Mr. Telles presented accounts payable for October 25th, November 1st and November 8th. Mr. Telles also presented payroll authorization for November 6th.

Commissioner Aguilar and Chairman Eaton commented that if at all possible they would like to see local vendors used for purchases such as employee's boots and other items.

Robert Gallegos- Mr. Gallegos spoke in regards to using local vendors for buying boots. He stated that he has dealt with them before and he feels that the local vendors jack the prices up and have a limited supply.

CONEJO FUNDING OPTIONS FOR FY 2013-2014

SUMMARY

It was anticipated that the Conejo Transfer Station would be turned over to Waste Management as part of their contract some time during FY 2013-2014. As a result, the Conejo facility was only partially funded for the current budget cycle. As of November, 2013, the facility is still managed by Valencia County. Currently, there is funding to continue its current 5-day operation through December 2013.

We are anticipating retaining the facility through the end of the fiscal year. Therefore, additional funding is needed to continue to maintain the existing level of service being provided at Conejo.

Needed funds are indicated below:

In addition to the operating expenses, the projected revenues from Conejo were also under-budgeted during the current budget cycle. It is estimated that Conejo will provide an additional \$146,156 through tipping fees collected at the facility. These funds will be used to offset the operational costs. Taking into account the estimated expenses in addition to the additional revenue and budget adjustments, the Solid Waste budget is currently underfunded by an amount equal to \$102,606.

There are currently a number of options available to fund this amount. These options may be exclusive or combined.

OPTION 1: BUDGET ADJUSTMENT WITHIN PUBLIC WORKS FROM ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Advantages:

- Money can be moved within the Public Works Division during the mid-year budget adjustments.
- The entire amount (\$102,606) can be found within the existing Road Construction budget.

Disadvantages:

 There has already been a budget adjustment of \$42,500 from this account into the Trash Disposal line item to cover these costs through the end of the second quarter. If an additional \$102,606 is

CONEJO FUNDING OPTIONS FOR FY 2013-2014

- adjusted out of this account, the total adjusted amount (\$145,106) will amount to 48% of the approved budget for this line item.
- This line item is used for all types of road maintenance activities, including the purchase of hot/cold mix for pothole repairs; salt and cinder mix for snow removal; and millings, base course, and gravel for road repairs.

AVAILABLE FUNDING = \$102,606

OPTION 2: BUDGET ADJUSTMENT WITHIN PUBLIC WORKS FROM CONSTRUCTION PROJECT

Advantages:

- This fund is created from the General Fund and gives the Commissioners additional funding for their individual project.
- Money can be moved within the Public Works Division during the mid-year budget adjustments.
- The entire amount (\$102,606) can be found within the existing budget.

Disadvantages:

- Requested projects from each County Commissioner may be placed on hold for lack of funding.
- A budget adjustment of \$102,606 from the Construction Project line item will reduce the remaining budgeted amount to \$52,015.

AVAILABLE FUNDING = \$102,606

OPTION 3: INCREASE TIPPING FEES AT CONEJO

Advantages:

- Solid waste disposal moves toward becoming a self-sustaining operation.
- Funding through other County programs is not required.
- Savings of \$8,089 to \$162,341 (dependent on option) annually could be realized and directly used to
 offset costs at Conejo.

Disadvantages:

- Increasing the current tipping fees would require Commission approval.
- Possible public opposition to an increase in the tipping fees.
- Illegal dumping may increase as a result of increased tipping fees.

AVAILABLE FUNDING = \$4,044 to \$81,170 (based on a 6-month savings from January to June)

CONEJO FUNDING OPTIONS FOR FY 2013-2014

OPTION 4: REDUCE THE NUMBER OF DAYS CONEJO IS OPEN

Advantages:

- Once communicated, the reduction in open days can be immediately implemented.
- Employees would be transferred to work within other areas of Public Works on the additional closure days.
- Reduce equipment operating and maintenance costs
- There would be an estimated reduction in annual costs at Conejo of \$35,000 to \$50,000 for every day per week Conejo is closed.

Disadvantages:

- Operational savings would include only diesel fuel costs, trash disposal costs, and equipment
 maintenance/repair costs. Labor and benefits would still need to be covered through additional
 budget adjustments.
- There could be an increase in public disapproval resulting in increased illegal dumping.

AVAILABLE FUNDING = \$17,500 to \$25,000 per closed day (for remaining ½ of fiscal year)

OPTION 5: RECYCLING EFFORTS

Advantages:

- An immediate cost savings related to disposal for each ton of waste diverted. Plus an additional savings related to fuel and equipment/repair costs.
- Savings are estimated to be approximately \$600/month once the Belen MOU is cancelled. There would be \$350/month in disposal savings, plus a 5% reduction in operational costs. These savings are estimated to increase as public participation increases.
- Recycling diverts wastes that cause management problems, such as cardboard.
- There are grant funding sources available to assist with initial startup costs.
- There is an opportunity to build cooperative efforts with other local entities.
- Valencia County can begin to satisfy public requests for recycling in addition to our existing scrap metal/appliance program.

Disadvantages:

- Approximately \$4,000 is needed to construct a concrete pad for collection containers and a block wall with wire fencing to keep unsecured paper and cardboard from becoming a litter nuisance.
- Operational savings would include only diesel fuel costs, trash disposal costs, and equipment maintenance/repair costs. Labor and benefits would still need to be covered.
- Savings are dependent on the amount of public participation.
- Requires consideration in Procurement Department's Disposal Plan.

ORDINANCE № 2013-__ PAIN CAPABLE UNBORN CHILD PROTECTION ORDINANCE

RECITALS

WHEREAS, NMSA 1978, Section 3-18-1 (1972) provides that municipalities, and also counties pursuant to NMSA 1978, Section 4-37-1 (1995), have the power to "protect generally the property of its municipality and its inhabitants" and to "preserve peace and order"; and,

WHEREAS, NMSA, 1978 Section 4-37-1 et seq. NMSA 1978 provides that counties may adopt ordinances, not inconsistent with statutory or constitutional limitations placed on counties, to discharge those powers necessary and proper to provide for the safety, preserve the health, promote the prosperity and improve the morals, order, comfort and convenience of the county and its inhabitants; and,

WHEREAS, anatomical studies have documented that a baby's pain network—the spinothalamic pathway—is established by 20 weeks gestation; and,

WHEREAS, surgeons entering the womb to perform corrective procedures on tiny unborn babies have seen those babies flinch, jerk and recoil from sharp objects and incisions; and,

WHEREAS, ample medical research has shown that unborn babies at 20 weeks development actually feel pain more intensely than adults; and,

WHEREAS, there is substantial medical evidence that an unborn child is capable of experiencing excruciating pain by at least 20 weeks after fertilization; and,

WHEREAS, statistics show a higher rate of complications and death for the mother and therefore a greater risk to her the later in the pregnancy an abortion is performed.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED that the Valencia County Board of Commissioners does hereby establish Valencia County Pain Capable Unborn Child Protection Ordinance, as follows:

GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1. TITLE.

This Ordinance and any amendment hereto shall be known and may be cited as the Valencia County Pain Capable Unborn Child Protection Ordinance.

SECTION 2. INTENT.

It is the intention of this ordinance to prohibit elective abortions on unborn children that are 20 weeks of gestation or later.

SECTION 3. ABORTION DEFINED.

- A. "Abortion" means the use or prescription of any instrument, medicine, drug, or any other substance or device to intentionally kill the unborn child of a woman known to be pregnant; or to intentionally and prematurely terminate the pregnancy of a woman known to be pregnant, with an intention other than to increase the probability of a live birth or of preserving the life or health of the child after live birth.
- B. "Medical emergency" means a condition that, in reasonable medical judgment, so complicates the medical condition of the pregnant woman that it necessitates the immediate abortion of her pregnancy without first determining postfertilization age to avert her death or for which the delay necessary to determine postfertilization age will create serious risk of substantial and irreversible physical impairment of a major bodily function, not including psychological or emotional conditions. No condition shall be deemed a medical emergency if based on a claim or diagnosis that the woman will engage in conduct which she intends to result in her death or in substantial and irreversible physical impairment of a major bodily function.
- C. "Reasonable medical judgment" means a medical judgment that would be made by a reasonably prudent physician, knowledgeable about the case and the treatment possibilities with respect to the medical conditions involved.
- D. "Unborn child" or "fetus" each mean an individual organism of the species homo sapiens from fertilization until live birth.
- E. "Woman" means a female human being whether or not she has reached the age of majority.

SECTION 4. UNLAWFUL CONDUCT.

Except in the case of a medical emergency, no abortion shall be performed or induced or be attempted to be performed either by medical means or chemical means on any unborn child older than 20 weeks gestation unless, in reasonable medical judgment, it is necessary to preserve the

life of the pregnant woman or prevent irreversible physical impairment of a major bodily function, not including psychological or emotional conditions.

SECTION 5. PENALTIES.

- A. Persons violating this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine not to exceed THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$300.00) and/or NINETY (90) days in jail for.
- B. Persons violating this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit their license to operate a business in the County of Valencia.

SECTION 6. SAVINGS CLAUSE.

If any article, section, paragraph, clause, word or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE & JURISDICTION

The effective date of this Ordinance is January 18, 2013 in the un-incorporated areas of Valencia County.

COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT

This Agreement is effective this 20th day of November, 2013 between the County of Valencia, hereinafter referred to as the "County" and AFSCME Council 18, Local # 1382 (Blue Collar), hereinafter referred to as the "Union".

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ARTICLE 1: PURPOSE

- 1.1 It is the purpose of this Agreement to promote and maintain harmony, cooperation and understanding among the County, its employees, and the Union in fulfilling their mutual and respective obligations.
- 1.2 It is further the purpose of this Agreement to provide orderly and constructive labor management relations between the County and the Union and to secure the prompt and fair disposition of grievances in order to assure the efficient operation of the Public Works and Animal Control Departments and uninterrupted service to the County.

ARTICLE 2: RECOGNITION

Pursuant to the certification issued by the Public Employees Labor Relations Board on September 27, 2012, the County recognizes the Union as the exclusive bargaining representative for all non-probationary employees of the County's Public Works Department and the Animal Control Department excluding all managerial, confidential, or supervisory employees and specifically excluding animal control officers, law enforcement, corrections and white collar employees.

ARTICLE 3: MANAGEMENT RIGHTS

- 1.1 Unless limited by the provision of this Collective Bargaining Agreement or by law, the Employer's rights shall include, but are not limited to, the following:
- 1.1.2 To direct and supervise all operations, functions, and work of the employees;
- 1.1.3 To hire, layoff, promote, demote, assign, reassign, transfer, discipline, discharge, or terminate employees;
- 1.1.4 To determine by whom and what services will be rendered to the citizens;
- 1.1.5To determine staffing requirements, create and /or abolish positions, and eliminate and/or reorganize work units;
- 1.1.6 To determine the need for new employees, to set minimum qualifications for all job classification, and to determine whether employees considered for transfer and promotion meet those qualifications;

- 1.1.7 To take action as necessary, notwithstanding the terms and conditions of this agreement, to carry out the mission of the County times of emergency as determined by the Manager or his/her designee;
- 1.1.8 The Employer retains all rights not specifically limited by this Collective Bargaining Agreement or the Law.

ARTICLE 4: REPRESENTATION

- 4.1 The Union retains the exclusive right to define its organization and to manage its internal affairs and the County shall recognize those employees designated as representatives of the Union in all matters arising from the administration of this Agreement. The Union shall advise the County Manager / or designee of the names, addresses and current working telephone numbers of Union representatives and identify their official positions within the Union. The Union shall promptly advise the County Manager of any changes in the foregoing information.
- 4.2 The County may allow Union representatives to visit County facilities for the purpose of administering the provisions of this Agreement at such times and places which do not interfere with the operations of the facility, subject to the prior written approval of appropriate director.
- 4.3 The Union may appoint up to four (4) Stewards to include the Chief Steward and provide the County with a list of such Stewards. The Union reserves the right to make any changes of Union Stewards at any time so long as the County is informed within a reasonable period of time.
- 4.4 The Union shall furnish the County with a list of all Union representatives, who are not County employees, who would have reason to visit County Buildings. All visits shall require 24 hours advance notice.
- 4.5 For any meeting called or agreed to by the County with respect to labor management relations issues between the County and the Union the County will agree to release the Union representative for a reasonable amount of time from the employee's work duties in order to handle Union business, provided that such time does not appreciably interfere with the operations of the County. Employees shall not be paid by the County to conduct Union business. However, any meetings agreed to by the parties in administering this Agreement will be consider regular hours worked if the meetings are during the union steward or union officers regular shift, this shall not apply to contract negotiations.

ARTICLE 5: NON-DISCRIMINATION

- 5.1 No employee shall be discriminated against by reason of union membership or non-membership or activates on behalf or in opposition to the Union.
- 5.2 Written personnel policies and procedures that affect bargaining unit employees and shall be applied consistently in similar circumstances to the employees whom the policies and procedures apply.

- 5.2.1. Accommodations made to persons determined by the Employer to be qualified individuals with a disability shall not serve as precedent for other employees.
- 5.2.2 With the exception of personnel policies and procedures dealing with compliance with the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA), the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), the Age Discrimination and Employment Act (ADEA), the Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA), the Equal Pay Act (EPA), and the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (OSH Act) and all other applicable federal and state laws, regulations, and alleged violations of this article may be grieved in accordance with the Grievance Procedures.

ARTICLE 6: NON-INTERFERENCE

The Parties acknowledge that each is free to conduct its affairs and business in the manner which each respectively believes to be in its own best interests. Accordingly, the Parties agree that neither shall interfere with the internal business affairs of the other; nor with the officials or representatives of the other in the conduct of their internal business affairs and other matters not involving the collective bargaining relationship.

ARTICLE 7: COMMUNICATIONS

- 7.1 It is understood by the Parties that inaccurate information, incomplete information or the failure to exchange information is one of the major causes of breakdowns in the labor-management relationship. In the interest of preventing misunderstandings stemming from such lapses in communications the Parties agree to furnish information relevant to the labor management relationship.
- 7.1.2 The Union shall provide the County with a current list of Union officers, trustees, stewards and alternates. Such list shall describe the authority possessed by each individual, and shall be updated within one week of any such change.
- 7.2 The Parties agree to communicate only through the appropriate officials as designated by the County and the Union respectively.

ARTICLE 8: RECORDS INFORMATION

- 8.1 The Union shall request and the County shall provide public records to the Union pursuant to the Inspection of Public Records Act NMSA 1978, Sections 14-2-1 et seq. and as amended. This shall not apply to documentation relating to bargaining and disciplinary processes.
- 8.2 No material within County control, which contains adverse personnel actions or comments, shall be placed in an employee's personnel file without the employee being informed within five (5) working days thereof. The employee may insert a written response to any such matter in his file. An employee shall be permitted to inspect any departmental maintained or official personnel file that is maintained concerning his employment with the County.

- 8.3 Personnel files are the property of the County and access to the information they contain is restricted. Generally, only immediate supervisors and management personnel of the County who have a legitimate reason to review information in a file are allowed to do so. Employees who wish to review their own file should contact the Human Resources Manager's office. With reasonable advance notice, employees may review their own personnel files in County's offices and in the presence of an individual appointed by the County to maintain the files. Personnel files may also be released under the following circumstances.
- 8.3.1 Responding to or investigating complaints of discrimination or harassment;
- 8.3.2 An employee provides the Human Resources Department with a written authorization for release of the personnel file;
- 8.3.3 As needed as part of the hiring or promotional process;
- 8.3.4 As part of a discovery request in a judicial or administrative proceeding; and,
- 8.3.5 As required pursuant to the Inspection of Public Records Act, NMSA 1978, Sections 14-2-1 *et seq.* and as amended.

ARTICLE 9: OVERTIME AND COMPENSATORY TIME

- 9.1 Overtime. The Employer shall compensate FLSA nonexempt employees at the rate of one and one-half times the employee's regular hourly rate of pay for actual hours worked in excess of forty (40) hours during the employee's designated work week, (hereinafter referred to as "Overtime Pay"). The Employer may not adjust the length of any employees' workday or workweek solely for the purpose of avoiding payment of overtime or accrual of Comp Time, however the Employer may adjust the length of the workday or workweek for reasons of safety or operational necessity.
- 9.1.1 Employees working on an ongoing project may be required to finish the project based on business necessity those employees on that project will be paid overtime and will not be subject to any overtime selection process.
- 9.1.2 The Director shall first offer overtime to the employees under his/her supervision who are qualified to perform the necessary tasks and have the same skill set competency.
- 9.1.3 If more than one qualified employee volunteers to work overtime, the supervisor shall assign overtime based on Department seniority within the work group that he/she supervises.
- 9.1.4 The Director shall rotate overtime assignments in a fair and equitable manner. If no volunteers are available, then the supervisor/manager will designate employees capable and qualified to perform the work based on reverse agency seniority.
- 9.1.5 Mandatory overtime shall be rotated in a fair and equitable manner.

- 9.1.6 The Employer shall have the right to require employees to work overtime consistent with this section.
- 9.2 Compensatory Time
- 9.2.1 Compensatory time may only be authorized by the County Manger.
- 9.2.2 Compensatory Time for FLSA Non-Exempt Employees. FLSA non-exempt employees may accrue up to 240 hours of compensatory time off (hereinafter referred to as "Comp Time") at the rate of one and one-half hours for each hour of time worked where such time worked would otherwise be compensated by Overtime Pay.
- 9.2.2.1 When only Comp Time is offered, the employee may refuse the overtime assignment without penalty.
- 9.2.3 All unused Comp Time will be paid upon an employee's leaving the County, or upon death, shall be paid to the employee's named beneficiary or, if unnamed, to the employee's estate, on the next regularly scheduled payday.
- 9.3 Temporary Schedule Adjustment. In lieu of working over 40 hours in a work week an employee may request an adjustment of work hours rather than working beyond 40 hours in a work week. A temporary schedule adjustment must be used within the same pay period as the extra hours worked. Any temporary schedule adjustment must be approved by the Director.

ARTICLE 10: HEALTH AND SAFETY

- 10.1 The County shall provide to each employee employment and a place of employment which are free from recognized hazards that are causing or are likely to cause death or physical harm to employees.
- 10.2 The County will comply with applicable OSHA and other regulatory standards. Potential violations will be addressed first through the county and if not resolved may be pursued through the appropriate regulatory agency as described by Article 5 supra.
- 10.3 All employees shall comply with OSHA and other regulatory standards and all county and department rules, regulations and procedures which are applicable to his/her own actions and conduct.
- 10.4 Reporting Unsafe Conditions and Practices
- 10.4.1 Detection of unsafe working conditions and practices at the earliest possible time and prompt correction of hazards are essential elements of providing a safe workplace. Identification and reporting of potentially unsafe working conditions and practices is the responsibility of each employee.

- 10.4.2 All employees are responsible for reporting unsafe working conditions or practices to their immediate supervisor who will promptly investigate the situation and take appropriate actions. If corrective action is not taken, for any reason, the supervisor shall immediate report the unsafe condition or practice to the Director.
- 10.4.3 No employee is required to work under unsafe conditions or engage in unsafe work practices. Employees will report these unsafe circumstances to their immediate supervisor.

ARTICLE 11: WORK WEEK

- 11.1 For purposes of this agreement, the work week will be a calendar week beginning at 12:00 am Saturday and ending at 11:59 pm on Friday. All full-time employees normal work week will consist of forty (40) hours per week and shall include two (2) consecutive days off.
- 11.2 A pay period will be defined as a two-week period.
- 11.3 A normal work week shall consist of either five (5) consecutive days of eight (8) hours within a seven (7) day period or four (4) consecutive days of ten (10) hours within seven (7) day period or 12 hour shifts.
- 11.3.1The Employer may change established work schedules in order to meet legitimate public service and operational needs.
- 11.3.2 Assignment of overtime shall not constitute a change in the work schedule.
- 11.3.3 Prior to implementing any change in an employee's work schedule exceeding 30 in duration the Employer shall provide 7 days written notice to the Union and affected employees. Notice of any change in work schedule less than of 30 days in duration shall be reasonable according to the circumstances.
- 11.4 Employees working eight (8) hours or more per day shall be entitled to two (2) paid breaks per day employees working less than eight (8) hours per day shall be entitled to one (1) paid break per day. The authorized break may only last for fifteen (15) minutes, and any unauthorized extension will be unpaid, and may result in disciplinary action. Breaks may be limited or delayed if continuous work is required because of an emergency or unusual conditions. Breaks shall not to be used in conjunction with lunch or within one (1) hour of the scheduled stopping time as a matter of practice.
- 11.5 Meal Periods: All full-time employees may take one (1) 30-minute unpaid meal period each workday, not to be used in conjunction with breaks or early release. Unpaid meal periods shall not interfere with the operational needs of the Department.

ARTICLE 12: SENIORITY

12.1 Seniority within Valencia County is defined as length of continuous unbroken service as a Valencia County employee. Continuous unbroken service means there have been no breaks in

employment other than annual leave, sick leave or County authorized leave without pay for less than six (6) months.

- 12.2 Seniority within Classification is defined as the total length of unbroken and active service.
- 12.2.1 In the event an employee is promoted to a new classification the employee's classification seniority shall not be terminated until the 31" day following the change in classification.
- 12.3 Seniority within Department is defined as total length of continuous unbroken service within the department as a full-time non-probationary employee of Valencia County.
- 12.4 Seniority rights shall terminate with no further accrual under the following circumstances:
- 12.4.1 Termination of employment by voluntary resignation;
- 12.4.2 Discharge for just cause;
- 12.4.3 In a leave-without-pay status for more than six (6) months;
- 12.4.4 Retirement;
- 12.4.5 Failure to timely respond to recall notice, or rejection of recall; or
- 12.4.6 Layoff status for a period greater than six (6) months.

ARTICLE 13: LAYOFFS AND RECALLS

13.1 Layoff Procedure. Upon directive of the Board, the County Manager shall make the determination for layoffs after consulting with elected officials and department directors. When layoffs of more than one employee are required, layoffs shall be determined using the following criteria:

Position in order of priority:

- 13.1.1 Temporary employees,
- 13.1.2 Casual employees,
- 13.1.3 Probationary employees,
- 13.1.4 Part-time employees;
- 13.1.5 Funding Source;

- 13.1.6 Essential Need of the Position;
- 13.1.7 Value of the employee's position to the critical operation of the County or department;
- 13.1.8 Seniority compared to other employees being laid off in the same or similar positions and
- 13.1.9 Performance of the employee compared to other employees being laid off in the same or similar positions;
- 13.2 Layoff Return Privileges. Any full-time or part-time regular employee who is laid off and returns within six (6) months of layoff shall not have to serve a probationary period if the employee return to his/her previous position and the probationary period has been served. A laid off-returning employee will be credited for all unused sick leave remaining and not compensated for at the time of layoff if the employee returns within the six (6) month period. Layoff privileges end:
- 13.2.1 Six (6) months after the effective layoff date;
- 13.2.2 After an employee has refused employment in a position for which the employee is qualified and/or for which the pay rate is the same or higher than the position previously held;
- 13.2.3 When a laid off employee accepts another position with the County. A laid off employee accepting another position with the County shall serve the required evaluation period.

ARTICLE 14: HOLIDAYS

- 14.1 County paid holidays shall be as follows: designated by the Board of County Commissioners pursuant to the County Personnel Policy. A paid holiday means up to eight (8) hours paid compensation for time off in recognition of each designated County Holiday.
- 14.2 Holiday Premium Pay. An employee who is required to work on a holiday shall be compensated at his regular straight time hourly rate plus time and one-half up to the first eight (8) hours worked. Thereafter, the employee shall be compensated at his regular straight time hourly rate, until such employee qualifies for overtime under the provisions of this Agreement and the FLSA.
- 14.3 To receive Holiday Premium Pay, the employee is required to work the holiday and must actually work the holiday or any portion thereof. Administrative leave sick leave, annual leave, and all other authorized leave shall not qualify as time worked for the purpose of receiving Holiday Premium Pay.
- 14.4 If a holiday occurs while an employee is on a regularly scheduled day off, or administrative leave with pay for investigatory reasons the employer will change the employee's regularly scheduled day off to another day within the same pay period if possible. If it is not possible the employee shall receive straight time pay for such holiday and the day shall not be charged against accrued annual leave or sick leave; provided, the employee has worked his last

scheduled day prior to the holiday, and his first scheduled day after the holiday, unless the employee's absence has been otherwise excused or authorized.

14.5 The members of the bargaining unit shall receive 3 administrative days off annually, with pay for the life of the agreement only. The days shall either be granted on a general department administrative day(s) or on individually authorized days, as approved by the County Manager. Personal days shall not be used in conjunction with holidays, sick or annual leave. The entire time must be taken when requesting personal holiday leave. Personal holiday time may not be taken in hourly increments.

ARTICLE 15: SICK LEAVE

- 15.1 Sick Leave with Pay. Sick leave with pay is granted to a classified or unclassified employee when a medical reason keeps the employee from performing the duties of the position. Employees shall accrue a maximum of six (6) hours of sick leave per month for each completed month of service.
- 15.2 Sick Leave Authorization. Sick leave may not be used before it is accrued and must be authorized or denied according to County policy. Unless otherwise prescribed by separate department policy, the following procedures shall apply:
- 15.2.1 Reporting Sick Leave. For shift scheduled employees: sick leave shall be reported as soon as possible but no later than one (1) hour prior to the employee's work shift unless the nature of the illness or injury requires extended leave, certified by the employee's physician, and of which the employee's supervisor is notified. For all other employees: sick leave shall be reported as soon as possible, but no later than thirty (30) minutes following the start of their normal work day.
- 15.2.2 Sick leave shall be requested on the prescribed form and the approval or disapproval must be in writing. If an employee uses any falsehood to support a request for leave, any leave authorized may be rescinded and the employee may be subject to disciplinary action. Leave may be granted contingent upon the employee presenting sufficient justification. (Resolution 2006-20).
- 15.3 Certification of Illness for Sick Leave. A physician's written certification may be required prior to receipt of sick leave pay at the discretion of the elected official or department director when an employee is absent for three (3) or more consecutive work days to verify illness; or when there are excessive absences, a trend, or other evidence which appears to indicate that the employee is not ill.

ARTICLE 16: FITNESS FOR DUTY

16.1 The County endeavors to provide a safe and productive work environment for the benefit of its employees and the public they serve. Employees are expected to manage their health in such a way that they can safely and effectively perform their essential job functions and to discuss with their supervisor any circumstance that my impact their ability to do so. The County

may require professional evaluation of an employee's physical or mental capabilities to determine his or her ability to perform essential job functions. Such evaluations are conducted by an independent third-party, licensed health care professional and are undertaken only after careful review by Human Resources. To the extent possible, the County will protect the confidentiality of the evaluation and results.

- 16.2 This evaluation process is for only those situation where reliable observation indicates that the employee may not be physically or mental able to perform the essential functions of his or her position due to a physical or mental condition. It is not intended to be a substitute for sick or medical leave request, workers' compensation claims, allegations of violence in the workplace, situations where there is an immediate threat of harm or for performance management disciplinary process.
- 16.3 Procedures. If, by observation of an employee's behavior or by receipt of reliable information, the County has reason to believe that an employee may lack the ability to perform the essential functions of his or her position due to a physical or mental condition, the following steps will be taken:
- 16.3.1 The department head or elected official will provide Human Resources with detailed information regarding the reason for and circumstances leading up to the fitness-for-duty referral, including information on essential job functions, evidence of the employee's inability to perform those functions effectively, and any attempts at resolving the matter.
- 16.3.2 The Human Resourced Director will review the information provided in the referral, along with a current job description of the essential functions of the employee's position. If it is determined that a fitness-for-duty evaluation is necessary, the Human Resources Director or designee will notify the employee in writing, the Employee may then contact his/her union representative.
- 16.3.3 Human Recourses will determine the independent, third-party, licensed health care professional who will perform the evaluation, send a written request for an evaluation to him or her, and will schedule the evaluation at the earliest opportunity.
- 16.3.4 Failure on the employee's part to comply with a scheduled fitness-for-duty evaluation constitutes insubordination and will be cause for disciplinary action, including termination.
- 16.3.5 All costs of the health care services performed by the health care professional as part of the evaluation will be paid by the County.
- 16.3.6 If the County Manager deems it necessary, the employee may be placed on temporary, paid administration leave until the evaluation is completed.
- 16.3.7 The employee will be requested to sign a voluntary written authorization allowing the health care professional to provide certain information obtained through the evaluation to the County. If no authorization is executed, the County may nevertheless obtain a description of the

functional limitations of the employee that my limit the employee's ability to perform the essential function of his or her job, but no statement of medical cause may be disclosed.

- 16.3.8 Insofar as feasible, the results of the evaluation will be treated as confidential, kept in a separate file within Human Resources, and the minimum necessary information will be shared only with those who need to know the results for legitimate county business purposes.
- 16.3.9 If it is determined that the employee is not able to perform the essential functions of his or her position, Human Resources will attempt to determine if there is a reasonable accommodation that will allow the employee to continue working. If an appropriate accommodation cannot be made other options will be identified and communicated the employee as available.
- 16.3.10 If it appears that any functional limitations on the employee's ability to perform the essential functions of his or her position are the result of a work-related injury, the matter will be referred to Workers Compensation for the procession of a workers' compensation claim.
- 16.3.11 All actions taking in carrying out this policy will comply with state and federal laws, as well as County policies and procedures and applicable contractual provisions.
- 16.4 Evaluation and Results. The fitness-for-duty evaluation will not be conducted for the purpose of diagnosis or treatment, but rather for the purposes of determine and employee's ability to perform the essential functions of the job. Hunan Resources will provide the evaluator with a description of the essential function of the employee's position prior to the evaluation. The evaluator will be asked by Human Resources to release only that information as permitted under this policy or otherwise permitted or required by law. The evaluator will be asked to complete a written report containing only the following information:
- 16.4.1 A conclusion regarding the determination of fitness for duty;
- 16.4.2 A description of the nature and extent of any functional limitation on the employee's ability to perform his or her job;
- 16.4.3 A description of the expected duration of each such functional limitation; and
- 16.4.4 An opinion as to whether or not the functional limitation may be the result of a work-related injury as related by the employee; further medical examination or investigation may be necessary to determine if the functional limitation arises out of, or has been caused by, the employee's occupation.
- 16.5 Insofar as feasible, the results of the evaluation will be treated as confidential, and will be shared only with those who need to know the results for legitimate County business purposes. However, where the employee has placed at issue his or her medical history, mental or physical condition, or treatment, the relevant information may be used and disclosed by the County in connection with such proceedings.

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16.6 The County Manager will make a decision regarding the employee's status, including but not limited to the employee's return to duty or removal of the employee from any duties pending treatment and re-evaluation, depending on the results of the evaluation and the recommendation of the evaluator. In certain circumstances the employee may be subject to medical disability termination.

ARTICLE 17: DISCIPLINE IN GENERAL & PRE-DISCIPLINARY INVESTIGATIONS

- 17.1 General Statement.
- 17.1.1 The County shall discipline employees only for just cause. Just cause is defined as follows: as any conduct, action or inaction arising from or connected with the employee's work, which is inconsistent with the employee's obligation to the County and reflects the employee's disregard of the County's interest. This also includes behavior or conduct at or outside of work that is inconsistent with the County's Code of Conduct. Just cause includes, but is not limited to, inefficiency, incompetence, misconduct, negligence, insubordination, performance which continues to be inadequate after reasonable efforts have been made to correct the performance problems, or conviction of a felony or misdemeanor.
- 17.1.2 The purpose of this Article is to encourage the use of counseling and positive discipline as methods of assisting employees in correcting work violations and behavior and improving job performance.
- 17.1.3 All disciplinary action, constructive criticism, or counseling shall be conducted in private.
- 17.1.4. An employee shall be progressively disciplined whenever warranted. All actions involving substandard work performance, leading up to and including dismissal, require documented progressive discipline. The step of corrective action used depends on the severity of the infraction and the employee's previous work record. Because of the serious nature of some infractions, the first disciplinary action may be suspension or dismissal.
- 17.1.5 Employees may be disciplined for those reasons set forth in the County Personnel Policy, for violations of Departmental policy, for violations of State law or for reasons that others are considered just cause.
- 17.1.6 Any department manager overseeing the employee in his/her department is authorized to initiate the disciplinary process. Although unusual, this process may also be initiated by the County Manager or his/her designee.
- 17.2 Range of Discipline. The range of discipline is as follows:
- 17.2.1 Verbal Reprimand. A verbal reprimand is used for minor infractions to inform the employee that his/her actions, behavior or conduct needs to change. Supervisors will

keep written notations of verbal reprimands, and these will not be placed in the employee's personnel file unless made a part of a later written reprimand.

- An employee is typically issued a written reprimand 17.2.2 Written Reprimand. in circumstances where the infraction is perceived to be of a greater consequence than that for which an oral reprimand is typically issued or if a prior oral reprimand to correct the same or similar behavior was ineffective. Written reprimands shall be placed in the employee's official personnel file after providing the employee with a copy of the reprimand. The employee shall acknowledge having received the reprimand by affixing his signature to the reprimand. So doing shall not be construed as the employee's agreement that the reprimand was warranted. If the employee refuses to sign, said refusal to sign shall be noted on the document by the employee's supervisor, and a witness shall attest in writing that the statement was presented for signature to the employee, who refused to sign. The witnesses signature, witness' signature, or employee's signature indicates that the employee received the statement, but does not necessarily indicate concurrence with its content. In addition, the supervisor may read the letter of reprimand to the employee. The employee may respond with a written rebuttal within thirty (30) days after the document was entered into the personnel file, which shall also be placed in the employee's personnel file. The placement of a written reprimand in an employee's file is not grievable.
- 17.2.2.1 Upon receipt of a written request from the employee, one (1) year after a written reprimand has been issued, the written reprimand shall be removed from his personnel file, provided that the employee has received no further discipline for the same or similar offense. In the event of a same or similar offense within the one (1) year period, the written reprimand shall be permanently included in the employee's personnel file. Any removed reprimand shall be placed in a soft file and will not be used for disciplinary purposes.
- 17.2.3 Suspensions and Demotions. An employee may be suspended without pay for a period not to exceed thirty (30) working days, and/or demoted for a single serious offense or for continued substandard job performance or misconduct when previous attempt(s) to correct behavior have failed or when an employee has engaged in a single serious event which is unacceptable for County employees.
- 17.2.3.1 Dismissal. An employee may be dismissed when other discipline has failed to improve unacceptable behavior or job performance, or when an employee has engaged in a single serious event which is unacceptable for County employees.
- 17.2.4 Counseling and/or performance improvement plans are not considered discipline.
- 17.3 Pre-Disciplinary Investigations.
- 17.3.1 At any meeting where the Employer is investigating any employee for possible disciplinary actions, the Employer shall:
- 17.3.2 Notify the employee at the outset of the meeting that the employee is being investigated for possible disciplinary action on request, allow the employee the opportunity for

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union representation; and if the Employer elects to proceed with the interview, provide the employee with a reasonable amount of time to confer with his/her representative.

- 17.3.3. The Employer may not make an audio or video recording of such interview unless it notifies the employee at the outset of the meeting of its intention to do so. If the Employer does elect to make audio or video record of the meeting, the employee shall be provided with a true and correct copy recording. In addition, if the Employer is recording the meeting, the employee may also record the meeting provided that the meeting will not be unduly delayed while the employee obtains a recording device. An employee may refuse to answer questions of a superior that probe possible criminal conduct until the employee has obtained legal advice and/or counsel.
- 17.3.4 A written notification of investigation, also known as a target letter, shall be initiated within ten (10) working days of the commission, omission or discovery of the act that precipitated the charges and the investigation. A Target letter shall not be necessary if the investigation is completed within 24 hours and the proposed discipline is for 36 hours or less. The target letter shall be delivered to the Employee. Such notification shall not disclose any facts of the investigation or allegation, but merely the nature of the investigation or allegation. The notification shall also include any assigned investigative numbers and the name of the employee under investigation. Information shall not be released when the nature of the investigation may jeopardize the investigation, for example, undercover investigations, in these cases the association president shall merely be notified that there is an investigation and no other information shall be given. In cases where extensive investigation is required, disciplinary action will not be initiated until the facts have been established.
- 17.3.5 Within 30 days of the employees receipt of a target letter the employee shall be notified that either he or she is no longer being investigated or of the intend to discipline the employee for the act or omission. This 30 day period may be extended if the investigation is obstructed or delayed for a reason beyond the employer's control. Any notice provided to the employee that he or she is no longer being investigated does not preclude the Employer from reinitiating the investigation if additional facts come to light. If the Employer determines that the investigation must proceed beyond the 30 day limit the Employer shall notify the employee in writing of the extension of the investigation and the grounds for the extension.
- 17.3.6 If no offence is found as a result of the investigation the employer shall provide the employee with a notice of termination of the investigation.
- 17.3.7 If the employer determines that a verbal or written reprimand is justified by the employees act or omission that discipline shall be provide at the end of the investigation. However, no formal investigation is required for the issuance of a verbal or written reprimand.
- 17.3.7 If the employer determines that the investigation has established facts that warrant just cause discipline to result in suspension, demotion or dismissal the employer may proceed with the disciplinary process as outlined in Section 18 A infra.
- 17.3.8 Dismissal, demotion, and suspension require consultation with the Human Recourses Director and the County Attorney before taking disciplinary action. Whenever such

consultation is not practical because of urgency, necessary action may be taken and the situations/ circumstances reviewed with the County Attorney as soon as practical.

17.4 Procedure Suspension, Demotion or Dismissal.

Disputes regarding suspensions, demotions or dismissals shall be contested utilizing the Grievance Procedure set forth in this Agreement.

ARTICLE 18 (A): PRE-DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE AND DISCIPLINARY GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

- 18A.1.1 Initiation of Discipline: All disciplinary action in the nature of suspension, demotion or dismissal shall be preceded by a written Notice of Intent to Discipline which shall include the conduct, action or omission which form the basis for the contemplated disciplinary action as well as the proposed discipline. The notice of intended discipline shall also identify any policy, regulation, procedure or statute violated.
- Upon receipt of a Notice of Intent to Discipline the employee and/or his/her representative shall be entitled to review all documentation or recorded statements that relate to the disciplinary action. The pre-disciplinary hearing shall not be held until the employee or his union representative has had seven (7) calendar days to review the information.
- 18A.1.3 Administrative Leave with Pay. In cases where County property, other employees or citizens or their property are at risk because of the employee's actions, the County Manager or in his/her absence, an appointed designee shall put the employee on administrative leave with pay until the pre-disciplinary hearing is held and a decision is rendered.
- 18A.1.3.1 Temporary Reassignment Lieu of Administrative Leave with Pay. In lieu of placing an employee on administrative leave with pay pursuant to section 18A.1.3 the County Manager may temporarily reassign the employee to another unit, shift or other work assignments, unrelated to seniority rights. This provision may only be implemented if it is determined that persons or property in the employee's immediate work environment are at risk based on the employee's actions but that there is no threat to persons or property if the Employee is re-assigned. Temporary Reassignments may not be punitive in nature. In order to temporarily reassign an employee the County Manager must first attempt to reassign the employee a similar assignment. The County Manager shall only assign the employee to a work assignment outside the Detention Center if another shift or post is not available in the Detention Center or if a such a reassignment is a safety risk. Temporary reassignment shall not exceed thirty (30) calendar days.
- 18A.1.4 This procedure shall be the sole and exclusive method of implementing and grieving discipline.
- 18A.1.5 The employer shall make an audio recording of steps 2 or 3 of the disciplinary process. If requested the employee shall be provided with a true and correct copy any recordings
- 18A.2 Steps In The Disciplinary Process.

- 18A.2.1 Step 1 Pre-Disciplinary (Loudermill) Hearing Meeting. The Director or his/her designee shall meet with the employee and his Union representative if he or she or the representative chooses to participate, at the appointed time. The County Attorney may also be present. At this hearing the employee will have an opportunity to respond to the reasons for the disciplinary action set forth in the Notice of Discipline. Witnesses are permitted as determined relevant to the case by the Director but the rules of evidence do not apply.
- 18A.2.1.1 The Director or his/her designee will issue a decision in writing within seven (7) calendar days of the Step 1 Pre-Disciplinary Hearing Meeting. The decision will include the time, date and location of the meeting, persons present, and the determination. The written decision shall be either delivered to the employee (obtaining the employee's signature of receipt of the decision) or be sent to the employee be certified mail, return receipt requested.
- 18A.2.1.2 Within seven (7) calendar days of receipt of the written decision, the employee must notify the Human Resources Director in writing of his/her intent to pursue review of the Director's decision to step 2 below. If the employee fails to participate in Step 1 or does not provide a timely notification to the Human Resources director as described above the discipline shall be implemented and the employee will not have the right to proceed to Steps 2 and 3. If a timely notice is provided by the Employee the decision of the Director shall be stayed pending the outcome of the Step 2 Hearing.
- 18A.2.1.3 Within seven (7) calendar days of the receipt of the notice of appeal of the Director or his/her designee's decision the Human Resources Director shall schedule a meeting with the County Manager or his/her designee to review the decision of the Director or his/her designee. The Step 2 hearing shall be scheduled within seven (7) calendar days of receipt of the notice of appeal. The Director and the Employee shall be entitled to review all documentation or recorded statements that relate to the disciplinary action at least 5 calendar days prior to the Step 2 Hearing.
- 18A.2.2 Step 2 Pre-Disciplinary Hearing Meeting with the County Manager. The County Manager or his/her designee shall meet with the Director and the Employee at the scheduled time. The Employee may be represented by a Union representative and the County Attorney may also be present. At this hearing the employee will have an opportunity to respond to the reasons for the disciplinary action and explain why the Director's decisions should be overturned or modified. The Director or his/her designee shall have the opportunity explain the reasons for his/her decision. Witnesses are permitted as determined relevant to the case by the County Manager or his/her designee but the rules of evidence do not apply.
- 18A.2.2.1 The County Manager or his/her designee will issue a decision in writing within seven (7) calendar days of the Step 2 Hearing Meeting. The decision will include the time, date and location of the meeting, persons present, and the determination. The written decision shall be either delivered to the employee (obtaining the employee's, signature of receipt of the decision) or be sent to the employee be certified mail, return receipt requested. The County Manager or his/her designee may uphold or deny the Director's decision or may increase or decrease the level of discipline implemented.

- 18A.2.2.2 The decision of the County Manager or his/her designee shall be implemented immediately or as otherwise directed in the Notice of Discipline.
- 18A.2.2.3 Within seven (7) calendar days of receipt of the written decision, the employee must notify the Human Resources Director in writing of his/her intent to appeal the County Manager or his/her designee's decision and pursue a grievance of the discipline decision to step 3 below (Arbitration). If the employee fails to participate in Step 2 or does not provide a timely notification to the Human Resources director as described above the employees right to proceed to step 3 shall be waived. The Director or his/her designee shall not have the right to appeal the County Manager's decision to Step 3.
- 18A.2.2.4 If the dispute is not resolved at Step 2 the Union may proceed to Step 3 on the Employees behalf but an individual employee may not proceed without Union representation.
- 18A.2.3 Step 3 Arbitration Hearing on the Merits.
- 18A.2.3.1 The arbitration proceedings shall be conducted by an experienced labor relations arbitrator selected from the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service (FMCS) or by an arbitrator mutually selected by the parties. Upon receipt of a timely request the County and Union, shall jointly shall contact the FMCS and request a panel of seven (7) arbitrators. Arbitrators shall first be selected from the metropolitan pool and then the sub-regional pool prior to selection from the Regional pool. An arbitrator shall be selected through the process of alternately striking the names of arbitrators on the panel until only one remains. The remaining name shall be the arbitrator. The parties shall flip a coin to determine who shall strike the first name.
- 18A.2.3.2 The parties shall share the arbitrator's fees and costs equally. Any costs incurred by a party, not related to the arbitrator's fees and costs, shall be borne by the party incurring such costs.
- 18A.2.3.3 The following hearing rules shall apply:
 - a. In the event that a party raises the issue of arbitrabilty (e.g., the County contends that the time limits have not been properly met or that the matter alleged to have been violated does not meet the definition of a "dispute" as defined herein), this issue shall be submitted to the arbitrator selected by the parties for resolution of. The arbitrator shall first address the issue of arbitrability; if there is a finding that the dispute is arbitrable, then the arbitrator shall proceed to hear & rule on the merits of the case in a final written decision. If there is a finding that the issue is not arbitrable then the case shall be dismissed.
 - b. Each party shall submit pre-hearing statement to the arbitrator and opposing party, the statement shall include a statement of the issues, proposed stipulations a list of witnesses, a list of exhibits and estimated amount of time needed for the hearing fourteen (14) calendar days prior to the hearing date. The parties may agree to stipulate to witnesses, exhibits and timelines.

- c. The parties may present relevant evidence (subject to the reasonable discretion of the arbitrator to admit hearsay evidence), testify and argue the evidence, confront and cross-examine adverse witnesses and request the arbitrator to order discovery of standard information required in the arbitration of disciplinary actions.
- d. Witnesses shall be placed under oath before testifying.
- e. Proceedings may be continued or recessed by the arbitrator in the interest of justice or for the convenience of the parties involved.
- f. The arbitrator shall apply a "Just Cause" standard.
- g. An arbitrator shall excuse himself or herself from hearing a case in which the subject matter or circumstances are such as to seriously impede his or her ability to render an impartial decision.
- h. The arbitrator shall not communicate with the parties or witnesses relating to the facts or subject matter of the case, except during the hearing, without the consent of the Union representative and the County's representative.
- i. The hearing shall be held within thirty (30) calendar days of assignment of an arbitrator to the case and a decision shall be rendered within thirty (30) calendar days of the hearing, unless more time is mutually stipulated to by the parties.
- j. No reprisal or retaliation by any party to the Step 3 Arbitration Procedure shall be taken against the aggrieved Employee or participant as a result of participation in the process.
- k. The arbitrator shall render his/her decision including a statement of the rationale supporting the decision and may make such administrative remedies as are necessary. The arbitrator's decision shall be final and binding on the parties subject to judicial review pursuant to the standard set forth in the Uniform Arbitration Act. The arbitrator shall not have the authority to make an award, which includes a fine or other punitive damages or award of attorney's fees.
- In the event the selected arbitrator is unable to conduct the hearing on the merits within ninety (90) days the parties may by mutual agreement select a new arbitrator. The new arbitrator shall be selected by utilizing the process identified in Article 18A.2.3.1.
- m. The parties may agree to expedited Arbitration and request the Arbitrator to issue his/her Opinion and Award orally from the bench at the conclusion of the hearing.

ARTICLE 18 (B): CONTRACT DISPUTE PROCEDURE

18B.1.1 The purpose of the Contract Dispute resolution procedure is to resolve, at the lowest possible administrative level, all disputes which may arise out of the interpretation of this Agreement. An employee alleging a violation of this Agreement shall have the sole recourse of filing under this Article.

18B.1.2 Definitions

- a. "Contract Dispute" means a formal written complaint by a bargaining unit Employee or the County alleging that there is a violation of this Agreement (i.e., a matter involving the enforcement, application, or interpretation of this Agreement and does not include Discipline). Disputes may be resolved at any step of the dispute resolution process, up to and including arbitration.
- b. "<u>Disputant</u>" means a bargaining unit employee or group of covered Employees, the Union or the County.

18B.2 Step 1

The affected Employee may discuss the Contract Dispute with his/her immediate supervisor. This supervisor shall not consider a Contract Dispute unless it is submitted in writing no later than ten (10) calendar days after the affected Employee knew or reasonably should have known of the action, which precipitated the Dispute. The written dispute shall include the following:

Name of Employee or Union Representative Submitting the Grievance
Article/section of the Contract alleged to have been violated
Signature of Employee or Union Representative Submitting the Grievance

18B.2.2 The purpose for the Employee putting the Dispute into written form is to preserve the Employee's rights for further appeals as necessary. If at this point the parties are unable to resolve the Dispute, the Dispute shall proceed to Step 2. The time limits for Step 2 will begin on the day following the meeting with the supervisor.

18B.3 Step 2

18B.3.1 If the affected Employee's supervisor has not addressed the Dispute through the chain of command within seven (7) calendar days the affected Employee shall discuss the Dispute with the manager or his/her designee. Although no written documentation of the content of the Contract Dispute meeting is required, the date and time of the meeting itself shall be documented to establish that the appropriate time limits are being observed.

18B.4 Step 3

- 18B.4.1 If the Contract Dispute is not resolved at the Step 2 level, the Employee may file a written appeal with the County Manager within seven (7) calendar days. The time limits for Step 3 will begin on the day following the meeting with the manager or his/her designee. The County Manager shall meet with the Employee and such other personnel as he/she deems appropriate to resolve the Contract Dispute. The County Manager shall have seven (7) calendar days immediately following the meeting to respond in writing to the Contract Dispute.
- 18B.4.2 If the dispute is not resolved at Step 3 the Union may proceed to Step 4 on the Employees behalf but an individual employee may not proceed without Union representation.
- 18B.5 Step 4
- 18B.5.1 Formal Contract Dispute Resolution Procedure (Arbitration): All Contract disputes that have not been settled at Step 3 shall, upon written notice by the Union, be submitted through the arbitration procedure within twenty (20) calendar days. The time limits for requesting arbitration will begin upon receipt, by the Union, of the County Manager's decision. All requests for arbitration shall be delivered to the Human Resources Office. All dispute resolution filings shall include the information listed below:

- 18B.5.2. The arbitration proceedings shall be conducted by an experienced labor relations arbitrator selected from the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service (FMCS) or by an arbitrator mutually selected by the parties. Upon receipt of a timely request the County and Union, shall jointly shall contact the FMCS and request a panel of seven (7) arbitrators. Arbitrators shall first be selected from the metropolitan pool and then the sub-regional pool prior to selection from the Regional pool. An arbitrator shall be selected through the process of alternately striking the names of arbitrators on the panel until only one remains. The remaining name shall be the arbitrator. The parties shall flip a coin to determine who shall strike the first name.
- 18B.5.3. The arbitrator shall render his/her decision including a statement of the rationale supporting the decision and may make such administrative remedies as are necessary. However, the arbitrator shall not have the power to alter, amend, add to, or subtract from the terms of this Agreement. The arbitrator shall not have the authority to make an award, which includes a fine or other punitive damages or award of attorney's fees. The arbitrator's decision shall be final and binding on the parties subject to judicial review pursuant to the standard set forth in the

Uniform Arbitration Act. The parties shall share the arbitrator's fees and costs equally. Any costs incurred by a party, not related to the arbitrator's fees and costs, shall be borne by the party incurring such costs.

18B.5.4. Procedural Rules

- a. In the event that a party raises the issue of arbitrabilty (e.g., the County contends that the time limits have not been properly met or that the matter alleged to have been violated does not meet the definition of a "dispute" as defined herein), this issue shall be submitted to the arbitrator selected by the parties for resolution of. The arbitrator shall first address the issue of arbitrability; if there is a finding that the dispute is arbitrable, then the arbitrator shall proceed to hear & rule on the merits of the case in a final written decision. If there is a finding that the issue is not arbitrable then the case shall be dismissed.
- b. An arbitrator shall excuse himself or herself from hearing a case in which the subject matter or circumstances are such as to seriously impede his or her ability to render an impartial decision.
- c. The parties may present relevant evidence (subject to the reasonable discretion of the arbitrator to admit hearsay evidence), testify and argue the evidence, confront and cross-examine adverse witnesses and request the arbitrator to order discovery of standard information required in the arbitration of disciplinary actions.
- d. Witnesses shall be placed under oath before testifying.
- e. Proceedings may be continued or recessed by the arbitrator in the interest of justice or for the convenience of the parties involved.
- f. An arbitrator shall excuse himself or herself from hearing a case in which the subject matter or circumstances are such as to seriously impede his or her ability to render an impartial decision.
- g. The arbitrator shall not communicate with the parties or witnesses relating to the facts or subject matter of the case, except during the hearing, without the consent of the Union representative, the Disputant, and the County's representative.
- h. The hearing shall be held within thirty (30) days of assignment of an arbitrator to the case and a decision shall be rendered within thirty (30) days of the hearing, unless more time is mutually stipulated to by the parties.
- i. With the mutual written consent of the parties, the time limits for a review of a dispute at any level may be extended for a reasonable time to allow for a fair review.

- J. In the event the selected arbitrator is unable to conduct the hearing on the merits within ninety (90) days the parties may by mutual agreement select a new arbitrator. The new arbitrator shall be selected by utilizing the process identified in Article 18B.2.5.2.
- k. The parties may agree to expedited Arbitration and request the Arbitrator to issue his/her Opinion and Award orally from the bench at the conclusion of the hearing.

18B.2.5.5 General Rules

- a. No reprisal or retaliation by any party to the Contract Dispute shall be taken against a Disputant or participant as a result of participation in the processing of a Dispute.
- b. The steps laid out in this Article represent the complete Contract Dispute resolution procedure available to an Employee.
- c. If a Contract Dispute affects a group of two (2) or more Employees or involves an action or decision by the County that has a system wide impact, the Union may submit the Contract Dispute on behalf of the affected Employees. If the Union does submit such a Contract Dispute it shall do so at Step 2 of the procedural steps of the Contract Dispute Resolution Procedure, within the time limits as described in Step 1 of this article.
- d. The County will furnish the Union, upon written request, specific information that is not privileged and that is relevant to the Contract Dispute, such as time sheets, disciplinary documents, performance evaluations, etc. The arbitrator shall decide any issue of privilege or relevance. All documents related to a Contract Dispute shall be maintained as a permanent file, unless the Disputants agree to purge the record as resolution to a Contract Dispute.

ARTICLE 19: LEAVE

19.1 Annual Leave with Pay. Annual leave must be approved with at least three (3) days or more notice by the employee's supervisor prior to being taken. Employees accrue annual leave with pay in accordance with the following schedule, based upon continuous length of County service:

19.2 Proration. Annual leave accrued shall be prorated for maximum accrual hours permitted per each pay period, but in no case shall an employee accrue annual leave for time worked in

excess of forty (40) hours per week or in the case of law enforcement personnel in excess of eighty-six (86) hours per pay period.

- 19.2.1 Accrual Limitation.
- 19.2.2 A maximum of two hundred forty (240) hours of annual leave shall be carried forward after December 31 into the new calendar year.
- 19.2.3 Where operational needs preclude the routine approval of leave for vacation periods (40 or more consecutive hours), the approval and scheduling of vacation periods shall be on a first come first serve basis. Employees, who believe they will lose accrued vacation in any calendar year because they will have accrued more than two hundred and forty (240) hours and because of scheduling difficulties they have been unable to schedule vacation to utilize such hours in excess of two hundred and forty (240), shall confer with the Director on or before October 1 of each calendar year and the employee and the supervisor shall develop a schedule providing for contiguous leave time consistent with the employee's original request which will permit the employee to use such excess hours by the end of the calendar year. In the event that the scheduled leave is cancelled by the Employer, preventing the employee from reducing his/her accrual to less than two hundred and forty (240) hours by December 31, then the Director shall approve paid time off in the same amount of lost time in the next calendar year, to be used by the last full pay period ending in March.
- 19.3 Separation from Service Pay. Employees shall be paid for all accrued annual leave upon separation from County service, not to exceed a maximum of two hundred forty (240) hours.
- 19.4 Donating Leave Due To a Serious Injury or Illness. Donation of sick or annual leave is designed to assist classified and unclassified employees with a minimum of two (2) years continuous service who have exhausted all accrued leave and who have no other paid leave options available. This leave may be granted only in the event of a serious illness or injury as defined in this section.

Eligibility for Donated Leave.

A. Serious illness or injury is defined as:

- 1. A life threatening or catastrophic illness of, or injury to the employee, the employee's spouse, domestic partner, child or parent; or
- 2. An illness of, or injury to the employee which renders the employee incapable of performing the essential functions of their job as certified by a medical determination; or
- 3. An illness or injury to the employee, the employee's spouse, domestic partner, child or parent which requires hospitalization, rehabilitation, or hospice care; or
- 4. Serious illness or injury shall not include elective medical procedures, or mental or

emotional illness.

- B. Classified and unclassified employees with a minimum of two (2) years service are eligible to request donated leave.
 - 1. To request donated leave, an employee must have exhausted all accrued leave and have no other paid leave options available.
 - 2. Leave donations will be granted only in case of a serious illness or injury as defined in 19.6A.
 - 3. Employees shall not have had any attendance based corrective action within the past twelve (12) months.
 - 4. An employee must not have received donated leave in the twelve (12) months preceding the request; however, the County Manager, upon the recommendation of the department director, may authorize donation more frequently in extraordinary circumstances.
 - 5. If eligibility is at issue, the County Manager may find an employee eligible for reasons he/she deems medically compelling.
 - C. Procedure for Donated Leave.
 - 1. An eligible employee may request a donation of leave by submitting an application to the department director that shall include the following:
 - a. The name, social security number and rate of pay of the proposed leave recipient;
 - b. A description of the **serious illness or injury** which has prompted the request for donation of sick/annual leave to include a medical statement including the diagnosis, prognosis, required treatment and anticipated return to work date;
 - c. The anticipated amount of donated leave the recipient will require; and
 - d. Any other information, which may be required by the County to make a determination regarding the request.
 - 2. The department director will review the request and determine whether the requesting employee meets the eligibility criteria. If the department director approves the request, the director will submit the application for leave donation to the Human Resources Director for approval.
 - 3. The Human Resources Manager will review the request and ensure the request is supported with a medical determination regarding the **serious illness or injury** situation. If approved, leave donations will first be solicited for a period of two (2)

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weeks within the department of the affected employee. The County Manager may choose to solicit from other departments simultaneously if sufficient cause warrants it.

- 4. If insufficient leave is donated within the employee's department, the department director may request the Human Resources Manager recommend to the County Manager that donations be solicited countywide. If approved by the County Manager, leave donations may be solicited from other departments for a period of two (2) weeks.
- 5. The department director will coordinate, with the Payroll Section, the transfer of donated hours provided that employees donating annual have a sufficient number of accrued hours at the time of transfer.

D. Conditions of Donated Leave

- 1. Donated leave will be made on a hour to hour basis.
- 2. Donated leave must be charged to FMLA leave if the recipient has not exhausted the twelve (12) weeks FMLA entitlement.
- 3. Donated leave may be requested only one (1) time during a twelve (12) month period; however, the County Manager, upon the recommendation of the department director, may authorize donation more frequently in extraordinary circumstances.
- 4. Recipients of donated leave are responsible for notifying their department director and the Payroll Section of any change in status requiring the termination of donated leave status.
- 5. The leave recipient will not accrue annual or sick leave while on donated leave status.
- 6. No new enrollments or increases will be allowed to a deferred compensation account while an employee is on donated leave.
- 7. Once an employee returns to work from donated leave, either full time or part-time, all remaining donated hours will be reinstated to the donating employee(s) on a prorated basis.
- 8. Departments are responsible for ensuring that all relevant auditing and accounting procedures are followed.
- 9. Provisions regarding the confidentiality of medical records and information shall govern. Posted solicitation for donated leave will ensure the privacy of medical information. Disclosure of such information may be made only with the express written consent of the affected employee.

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- 10. Donated leave will not be granted as an extension of leave without pay of more than two (2) weeks. Donation of sick/annual leave is strictly voluntary. Denial of a request to solicit donated leave is not grievable.
- E. Employees may only donate leave if they maintain a sick leave balance of 40 or more hours.
- 19.5 Sick Leave Authorization. Sick leave may not be used before it is accrued and must be authorized or denied according to County policy. Unless otherwise prescribed by separate department policy, the following procedures shall apply:
- A. Sick leave shall be reported to the Director or supervisor as soon as possible, but no later than thirty (30) minutes following the start of their normal work day. Employees who do not speak directly to the Director or their supervisor are required to leave a voice mail or electronic message with the Director.
- B. Sick leave shall be requested on the prescribed form and the approval or disapproval must be in writing. If an employee uses any falsehood to support a request for leave, any leave authorized may be rescinded and the employee may be subject to disciplinary action. Leave may be granted contingent upon the employee presenting sufficient justification. (Resolution 2006-20).
- 19.5.1 Sick Leave Incentive. Employees who do not use any sick leave from January 1 to June 30 of a calendar year shall receive 8 hours of annual leave. Employees who do not use any sick leave from July 1 to December 31 of a calendar year shall receive 8 hours of annual leave.
- 19.5.2 Certification of Illness for Sick Leave. A physician's written certification may be required prior to receipt of sick leave pay at the discretion of the department director when an employee is absent for three (3) or more consecutive work days to verify illness; or when there are excessive absences, a trend, or other evidence which appears to indicate that the employee is not ill.
- 19.6 Bereavement Leave. In the event of a death in the employee's immediate family, he or she will be entitled to be eavement leave, not to exceed three (3) working days per year, which leave shall be with pay. The employee shall notify his or her department director prior to taking such leave.
- 19.7 Family Medical Leave.
- A. The County provides family medical leave of absence without pay to eligible employees who wish to take time off from work duties to fulfill family obligations relating directly to the birth or adoption of a child or the illness of a child, spouse, domestic partner, parent or the employee themselves. Regular full-time and part-time employees are eligible to request family leave as described in these Rules.
- B. Eligible employees are allowed family/medical leave according to provisions of the Family Medical Leave Act (FMLA). As soon as an eligible employee becomes aware of the

need for a family medical leave of absence, the employee shall request leave from their supervisor. Employees requesting family medical leave related to the illness of a child, spouse, domestic partner, parent or the employee themselves shall be required to provide a physician's statement verifying the need for leave. Eligible employees who do not request family medical leave in advance of a qualifying event will automatically be placed on family medical leave as soon as it is determined by the Human Resources Manager that their leave qualifies for protections under FMLA.

- C. Eligible employees are allowed up to twelve (12) weeks of family medical leave. Eligibility for leave will be determined on a twelve (12) month rolling-back calendar. The employee will be required to take any available annual or sick leave as part of the approved period of leave. If the family medical leave is unpaid, the employee is subject to all rules pertaining to leave without pay, section 19.20.
- D. Subject to the terms, conditions and limitations of the applicable plans, the County will continue to provide health insurance benefits for the full period of the approved family/medical leave, subject to all rules pertaining to leave without pay, Section 19.20.
- E. When family medical leave ends, every reasonable effort will be made to return the employee to the same position, if it is available, or to a similar available position for which the employee qualifies. The County guarantees reinstatement to all eligible employees who are not key employees. If the employee fails to return to work or contact their supervisor on or before their expected date of return, the County will assume that the employee has abandoned their job. The appointed positions as listed in the Personnel Policy ordinance are key employees within the County and may or may not be eligible to take family medical leave.
 - F. According to FMLA, key employees are not guaranteed reinstatement; however, the Board (for contract and unclassified employees), and a department director may authorize reinstatement, as appropriate subject to approval by the County Manager.
- 19.8 Personal Holiday. All employees who have completed six (6) months of employment will have a regular workday personal holiday each calendar year in addition to the regular holiday schedule. The personal holiday may be taken at any time, upon approval by the employee's supervisor. The entire time must be taken when requesting personal holiday leave. Personal holiday time may not be taken in hourly increments.
- 19.9 Administrative Leave. Administrative leave with pay may be granted by the County Manager pending an investigation or disciplinary action. Any employee, who is placed on administrative leave pending disciplinary action, will be required to be away from their place of employment and will not be allowed to perform any job related duties or retain any County property during that time. Administrative leave pending disciplinary action shall not exceed thirty (30) calendar days, unless an extension of time is approved by the County Manager.
 - A. Administrative leave with pay may also be granted by department director, subject to the

approval of the County Manager, with issues relating to due process procedures, whenever circumstances warrant such leave.

- 19.10 Workers' Compensation Program. [§§52-5-1 et. seq., NMSA 1978]
- A. The County provides a comprehensive worker's compensation insurance program at no cost to employees. This program covers any injury or anyone suffering from occupational diseases sustained in the course of employment as approved by the insurance carrier. Subject to applicable legal requirements, Workers' Compensation insurance provides benefits after a short waiting period, or if the employee is hospitalized immediately.
- B. Employees who sustain work-related injuries or occupational diseases must inform their supervisor immediately. No matter how minor an on-the-job injury may appear, it is important that it be reported immediately. This will enable an eligible employee to qualify for coverage as quickly as possible. A "First Report of Injury Form" shall be filed with the Human Resources Director following the work-related injury. The report shall be signed by the employee and the employee's supervisor. In addition, the supervisor's "Accident Investigating Report Form" will be filed not later than the following work day. All accidents shall be reported, however minor.
- C. Neither the County nor the insurance carrier will be liable for the payment of workers' compensation benefits for injuries that occur during an employee's voluntary participation in any off-duty recreational, social, athletic activity, or similar events off-duty.
- D. Subject to the terms, conditions and limitations of the applicable plans, the County will continue to provide health insurance benefits while the employee is receiving worker's compensation benefits, subject to the provisions of this Agreement. Eligible employees will automatically be placed on family/medical leave as soon as the Human Resources Manager determines that their leave qualifies for protection under the Act.
- 19.11 On-The-Job Injury Leave. An employee injured on the job may use accrued sick leave until exhausted and then the use of annual leave is permissible for each regularly scheduled working day after the injury occurs for all such days that are not paid by Workers' Compensation Insurance. If the employee is on worker's compensation time for more than four (4) weeks, and is entitled to compensation for the first seven (7) days and has used accrued leave for the first seven (7) days of injury, the workers' compensation payments received for all such days shall be paid directly to the County by the workers' compensation carrier. In the event an employee uses accrued leave, in lieu of workers' compensation, the leave used shall be re-credited to the employee upon the County's receipt of the reimbursement by the Workers' Compensation carrier after the expiration of the statutory waiting period.
- 19.12 Voting Leave. For purposes of national, state or local election, an employee who is registered to vote will be granted up to two (2) hours paid leave for voting, between the time of opening and the time of closing of polls. The employee's supervisor may specify the hours for the leave. This leave will not be granted to any employee whose work day begins more than two (2) hours subsequent to the time of the opening of the polls, or ends more than three (3) hours before the closing of the polls.

- 19.13 Court Service Leave With Pay. Pay for jury duty shall be authorized only for those days that the employee is scheduled to work. If excused by the court during a working day, the employee shall return to work. Employees serving as jurors shall file for jury pay and turn in any pay received to the County. Any jury duty worked beyond their regular work hours shall be refunded back to the employee.
 - A. Procedures for Jury Duty Time:
 - 1. <u>Juror Service Verification</u> form from the Court must be attached to the Leave Report Form.
 - 2. Reconciliation of time by Payroll will include matching <u>Jury Hours Summary Sheet</u> received by District Court to time sheet, leave form and <u>Juror Service Verification</u> form.
- B. Court Appearance Time. When required by County duties and subpoenaed to appear before a Court, personnel Hearing Officer, public body or the Board for the purpose of testifying in regard to County matters, the employee will be compensated as regular work time.
- 19.14 Leave Without Pay. The department director with the approval of the County Manager, may grant an employee leave without pay for a period not to exceed six (6) months, when the department director deems that such leave without pay is in the best interest of the County. The Director may approve leave without pay for up to 40 hours without County Manger Approval. Reasons for such leave may include, but are not limited to, medical disability, pregnancy, birth or adoption of a child, and the need to care for a family member. Leave without pay is subject to the following conditions:
- A. Re-employment upon Return. If an employee returns to work within three (3) months, the employee will be returned to the same position. If the employee is on leave without pay for more than three (3) months but less than six (6) months, the County will attempt to return an employee to the same or similar position for which the employee is qualified. The position of an employee on leave without pay for more than three (3) months shall not be guaranteed. If there is not a position for the employee at the end of six (6) months, the employee shall be dismissed.
- B. Physician's Certificate. Leave without pay requested due to medical reasons or pregnancy-related purposes must be accompanied by a physician's written statement indicating the estimated time disability or recommended time for post-natal leave. An employee returning to work from leave without pay due to medical or pregnancy-related reasons must be released by the employee's physician to return to work.
- C. Temporary Filling of Position. Temporary employees may be hired to fill vacancies created by an employee who is on leave without pay.
- D. Benefits at Employee's Expense. An employee on leave without pay does not accrue leave or County benefits. The employee wishing to continue receiving health insurance benefits may do so at the employee's expense by submitting a money order or cashiers of the employee's

share of the premium, made payable to New Mexico Risk Management Department, to the Valencia County Payroll Department on the Friday before payday.

- E. Failure to Report Timely. Failure on the part of the employee to report to work immediately to the assigned shift following the last day of the request, upon the expiration of approved leave without pay, shall be subject to disciplinary action.
- 19.15 Union Leave Without Pay. The Director may grant the Union President or acting president up to 40 hours of leave without pay annually for Union business only if the President has exhausted all of his/her annual leave. Union leave without pay may only be granted if it does not interfere with the operational efficiency of the department.
- 19.16 Life Threatening Illnesses In The Workplace. Employees with life-threatening illnesses, such as cancer, heart disease, and AIDS, often wish to continue their normal pursuits, including work, to the extent allowed by their condition. The County supports these endeavors as long as employees are able to meet acceptable performance standards. As in the case of other disabilities, the County will make reasonable accommodations in accordance with all legal requirements, to allow qualified employees with life-threatening illnesses to perform the essential functions of their jobs. The employee will be held to the standards set forth in Section 19.25.
- A. Medical information on individual employees is treated confidentially. The County will take reasonable precautions to protect such information from inappropriate disclosure. Management, as well as other employees, has a responsibility to respect and maintain the confidentiality of employee medical information. Anyone inappropriately disclosing such information is subject to corrective or disciplinary action up to and including dismissal of employment.
- B. The Health Insurance Probability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) require the County to maintain the privacy of protected health information. A copy of the County's HIPAA Notice of Privacy Practices can be obtained from the Human Resources Manager's office.
- 19.17 Inclement Weather. The County Manager, after consulting department directors may close offices, authorize late reporting or early release due to inclement weather, and all employees will be compensated for normal work hours as administrative leave with pay and shown on a Leave Report Form.
- 19.18 Leave For Unforeseen Circumstances. The County Manager, after consulting with department directors, may close individual offices, authorize late reporting or early release due to unforeseen conditions beyond the County's control that prevent the employees from performing their duties as administrative leave with pay and shown on a Leave Report Form.
- 19.19 Military Leave.

The Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA) protects the job and benefits, for up to five years (or more in some cases), of a service member who must

leave his or her civilian job because of military orders to report for training or active duty, voluntary or involuntary, in peacetime or wartime.

- A. Military Leave for Reserve or National Guard Activities (§ 20-1-1 NMSA 1978). USERRA requires service members, or a responsible representative of the military unit, to provide advance written or verbal notice to their employers for all military duty unless giving notice is impossible, unreasonable, or precluded by military necessity. Paid Military leave is granted for authorized reserve or National Guard activities for a maximum of fifteen (15) working days with pay during a one (1) year period based on the federal government's fiscal year from October 1 to September 30. Military leave must be requested twenty (20) working days in advance, unless a national or state emergency exists and an immediate call-up is initiated in which case notice as soon as possible is required. The employee must furnish proof of duty orders or other documentation prior to leave being granted unless the leave is for emergency purposes.
- B. Extended Unpaid Military Leave. Employees voluntarily or involuntarily serving on active duty for more than fifteen (15) working days may use accrued annual leave. When military leave has been exhausted, employees have the option of being placed on leave without pay (LWOP) or using accrued leave. Employees may use all of their annual leave on consecutive days or use up to twenty-seven (27) hours per pay period in order to maintain their group insurance benefits. Employees who exhaust their annual leave shall then be placed on LWOP for the remainder of time they are on active duty. Employees shall not receive pay or accrue leave while on LWOP. Employees wanting to maintain insurance benefits while on military duty will be required to pay the employee's share of their premium.
- C. Service members are entitled to return to their County job and receive pay raises, promotions, pension credit and other seniority benefits as if you had been continually employed, provided certain eligibility criteria are met. Protection under the USERRA applies if:
 - 1. The job the employee left was for more than a brief, non-recurrent period, with no reasonable expectation that such employment would continue indefinitely or for a significant period.
 - 2. The employee left this job for the purpose of entering active duty.
 - 3. The employee is discharged under honorable conditions.

AND

- 4. The employee applied for reemployment within the applicable time limit.
- D. If these criteria are met, the USERRA provides the following protections:
 - 1. The employee is entitled to return to the prior position with the same seniority, benefits, pay, and, additionally, any promotion or raise which could have been reasonably expected if the employee had remained continuously on the civilian job.

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- 2. The County is required to offer disabled veterans the "nearest approximation" of the job the service member could have reasonably expected with continuous employment.
- 3. Service members are protected from being discharged for the protected time period allotted by USERRA according to the time served on active duty, unless the County proves misconduct or violation of policies.
- 4. To be re-employed in the same position, the employee's return to work must occur within the following guidelines:
 - i. For a service period of 1-30 days, the employee must report to work immediately by the first regularly scheduled work day;
 - ii. For a service period of 31-180 days, the employee must make application for re-employment within 14 calendar days after he/she is relieved from training or duty;
 - iii. For a service period of 181 days or more, the employee must make application for re-employment ninety (90) calendar days after he/she is relieved from training or duty;
 - iv. An employee who is released from hospitalization of a service-related injury, continuing after discharge for a period of not more than one (1) year, must make application for re-employment ninety (90) calendar days after he/she is relieved from training or duty.
- E. Employees may qualify for up to twelve (12) weeks of leave for certain qualifying exigencies arising out of a covered military member's active duty status, or notification of an impending call or order to active duty status, in support of a contingency operation under the FMLA.
- 19.20 Light Duty Return-To-Work. Employees who are on leave due to an injury or illness may be eligible to return to work on light duty status after their physician certifies their fitness to do so. The department director and the Human Resources Director will determine if there is a position or duties suitable for an employee to perform light duty work. Employees eligible for light duty will first be assigned in their department, if there is no light duty work available in their Department the Human Resources Director will attempt to place the employee in other positions in the County. The County retains full discretion as to whether or not an employee is eligible for light duty status.
- A. Coordination with Attending Physician. An employee on leave due to a work-related disability can return to work only when the County receives the attending physician's written medical release authorizing such return. The Human Resources Manager is responsible for providing the physician with a copy of the employee's job description, copies of job descriptions for potential restricted duty assignments, and written information explaining the County's return-to-work program.
- B. Return-to-Work Options. Arrangements to facilitate an employee's early return to work are made in consultation with the employee's attending physician and/or other qualified medical professionals retained by the County or its insurance carrier. The following options will be

explored:

- 1. Return to prior position. An employee is offered the opportunity to return to his or her prior position if the attending physician certifies that the employee can perform the essential functions of the job with or without reasonable accommodations. Human Resources Director his/her designee is responsible for working with the employee's supervisor and attending physician (and third-party consultants, as necessary) to provide any reasonable accommodations.
- 2. Restricted duty. Any employees who are not yet able to return to their former duties are offered, subject to the restrictions set out in this Agreement, a temporary restricted duty assignment that has been approved by the employee's attending physician. The Loss Control Specialist is responsible for working with the employee's supervisor, the Human Resources Director, and the employee's attending physician to develop and implement the restricted duty assignment. The assignment can consist of the employee's regular job, with reduced working hours or reduced activities, or an alternative restricted duty position.
- C. Limitations on Restricted-Duty Assignments. The following limitations apply to restricted duty assignments:
 - 1. No guarantee of work. As provided this Agreement these Rules, the County will endeavor to return employees to gainful employment as soon as possible by exploring possible restricted duty assignments. However, the County does not guarantee the availability of restricted duty work.
 - 2. Pay rates and Workers' Compensation benefits. Employees on restricted duty are not guaranteed the rate of pay they received for the position they held at the time they sustained their work-related injury or illness. The pay rate for a restricted-duty assignment is based on the knowledge, skills, and abilities required for the job as well as general market conditions. Employees who return to work before they have reached maximum medical improvement (MMI) may be eligible for temporary partial disability benefits under the state Workers' Compensation program, if they earn less than they earned in the position held at the time they sustained the work-related accident or illness. Employees in restricted duty positions are not permitted to supplement their workers' compensation benefits by using their accrued annual, personal, or medical/sick leave.
 - 3. Six (6) week limit. Restricted duty assignments are temporary arrangements intended to complement and facilitate the healing process. Restricted-duty assignments cannot exceed Six (6) weeks without approval from the department director and approved by the County Manager.
- D. Employee Refusal of Work/Training. In the event that an employee refuses to return to regular or restricted duties in response to a written, *bona fide* offer of employment by the County

sent via certified mail, the employee is separated from the County and his/her position will be filled permanently (NOTE: An exception to this rule applies in the case of employees who have not yet exhausted their FMLA leave entitlement, refer to subsection G.

A written offer of employment must clearly state:

- 1. The position offered and the duties of the position;
- 2. The County's agreement to any limitations or conditions set out in the attending physician's certification of the employee's fitness to return to work;
- 3. The job's essential functions; and
- 4. The job's wage, working hours, and location.
- E. Permanent Disabilities. After reaching maximum medical improvement (MMI), if an employee has a permanent disability that impairs the employee's ability, with or without reasonable accommodations, to return to his or her regular position; the County, in consultation with the employee's attending physician and the state Workers' Compensation Department, must evaluate the following options:
 - 1. Securing vocational rehabilitation services from the state Department of Labor or private consultants, as appropriate. Services can include assessment and testing, counseling, and training;
 - 2. Finding a position at the County commensurate with the employee's knowledge, skills, and abilities;
 - 3. Paying employees with permanent disabilities partial or total permanent disability benefits as required under the state workers' compensation program.
- F. Coordination with FMLA. Nothing in these Rules should be construed as denying employees their rights under the FMLA or any other federal or state law.
- G. It is the County's policy to designate an employee's absence from work due to a work-related injury or illness as FMLA leave to the extent allowed by federal law.
- H. Employees entitled to FMLA leave can voluntarily accept restricted duty assignments while they are recuperating, but they cannot be required to do so. Employees who lose their workers' compensation benefits as a result of declining a restricted duty assignment are required to substitute any available paid leave, such as accrued annual, personal, or medical/sick leave, for unpaid FMLA leave.
- I. Until employees have exhausted their twelve (12) week FMLA entitlement, they have the right to be reinstated to their original job or an equivalent job providing they are able to perform the job's essential functions.

19.24. For the purpose of this Collective Bargaining Agreement Immediate Family Member is defined as Spouses, domestic partners, children, parents, siblings, grandparents, grandchildren, like in-laws, and like step-relationships and persons with legal custodial relationships.

ARTICLE 20: ECONOMICS

(Stipulated Re-Opener January 2014)

ARTICLE 22: UNIFORM AND DRESS CODE

- 21.1 Uniform Voucher. The County shall establish a voucher system whereby each eligible employees shall receive a voucher each fiscal year, being available the first full pay period each July, that is valued up to \$500 for uniforms. Employees will be given a purchase order payable to a Valencia County approved vendor and employees shall be responsible for obtaining their uniforms and the necessary patches/embroidery.
- 21.2 Personnel Appearance. The personal appearance of each employee reflects on the entire County. It is the responsibility of the employee to maintain all uniform clothing. Clothing will be worn and fit in a way that is professional in appearance. Uniforms will be kept neat, clean, and pressed or wrinkle-free. Faded, frayed, wrinkled, torn, spotted, stained, or mismatched parts of any uniform shall not be permitted. Worn or ill-fitting uniforms must be replaced. Uniforms are to be worn in the manner that they were intended to be worn and are not to be modified to satisfy personal desires, including but not limited to cutting off sleeves or collars and removing patches. Failure to maintain a professional appearance is subject to disciplinary action. All uniforms shall be within the dress code as approved by the Director.
- 21.3 Safety Shoes/Boots. Public Works employees covered by this agreement will be required to wear safety footwear while on duty. Shoes or boots purchased as safety shoes/boots shall be of ANSI-approved standards (ANSI Z41-current approved edition) and shall be steel-toed in order to qualify for the boot allowance. Animal Control techs covered by this agreement will be required to wear slip and water resistant shoe when appropriate for their duties.
- 21.4 Uniforms. The selected top wear of the uniform must be a shirt and must have the appropriate identification, including the Valencia County insignia on one breast of the shirt and the employee's name (first name, last name, or both) on the opposite breast of the shirt. Other insignia (i.e. approved departmental patches) may also be required. Outerwear must have the Valencia County insignia displayed. All top wear (shirts and jackets), outerwear, and coveralls must be dark in color. Denim jeans must be blue.

Approved uniform items (those items that qualify for the uniform voucher) for Public Works employees include:

- Denim jeans
- Denim shirts (short or long-sleeve)
- Cotton t-shirts (short or long-sleeve)
- Outerwear (summer or winter) vest or jacket
- Coveralls (insulated or uninsulated)

Rubber boots

Approved uniform items (those items that qualify for the uniform voucher) for Animal Control Kennel Techs include:

- Denim jeans
- Denim shirts (short or long-sleeve)
- Cotton t-shirts (short or long-sleeve)
- Outerwear (summer or winter) vest or jacket
- Smocks
- Rubber boots (when required)

21.5 Dress Code.

- a) Jewelry. Jewelry should be discrete and professional in appearance. Ear piercings are acceptable, provided the jewelry is of a conservative and professional nature. In order to maintain a safe workplace, wearing facial piercings other than in ears is not permitted (i.e. nose rings, eyebrow rings, tongue, etc.)
- b) Hair. Hair should be worn in a neat and tidy fashion and be of a discrete and professional color and style. If Occupational Health and Safety rules require it, long hair should be worn tied back.
- c) Tattoos. Tattoos that could be perceived to be offensive, should be discretely covered (i.e. tattoos of naked men/women, skulls, daggers dripping blood, etc.).
- d) National Garments. National costume and garments worn to comply with religious requirements are acceptable as long as they do not pose an Occupational Health and Safety risk and are neat and modest.
- e) Pregnant Employees. Pregnant employees are expected to adhere to the County's dress standards. If larger garments are required, accommodations may be allowed by the Director.

ARTICLE 22. SUBSTANCE ABUSE POLICY

This Article shall be effective upon the approval of the same or substantially similar policy by the Board of County Commissioners for non-bargaining unit County Employees. Until the same or similar policy is approved, the Valencia County Drug Workplace Policy, 401-01-3, Resolution 2006-18 shall be effective.

22.1 Purpose. The purpose of this policy is to assure worker fitness for duty and to protect our employees and the public from the risks posed by the misuse of alcohol, the use of prohibited drugs and the misuse of legal drugs. The County is concerned only with those situations where use of alcohol and other drugs seriously interferes with any employee's health, his/her job performance and adversely affects the job performance of other employees or is considered to be so serious as to be detrimental to the County's operations and the safety of himself/herself and others.

- 22.2 Safety Sensitive Employees. This policy applies to all positions within the AFSCME Blue Collar Bargaining Unit. Adherence to this testing policy is a condition of employment for all positions. Safety-sensitive functions refer to any functions contained within an employee's realm of responsibilities that have an impact upon the safety and general welfare of the public. It is agreed by the parties that employees required to have CDL and kennel techs are safety sensitive.
- 22.3 Minimum Thresholds. When the County requires a drug test, the employee's urine/blood shall be tested for the following drugs or their metabolites and a positive test result shall be reported to the Human Resources Director. Any positive at or above the following minimum thresholds shall be subject to termination.

Drug	Nanograms per Milliliter (ng/ml)
Marijuana metabolites	50
Cocaine metabolites	150
Opiate metabolites	2,000
Phencyclidine (PCP)	25
Amphetamines	500

- 22.4 Policy. The County of Valencia is dedicated to providing safe, dependable and economical services to our public. County of Valencia employees are our most valuable resource and it is our goal to provide a healthy, satisfying working environment, which promotes personal opportunities for growth. In meeting these goals, it is our policy to (1) assure that employees are not impaired in their ability to perform assigned duties in a safe, productive, and healthy manner; (2) create a workplace environment free from the adverse effects of drug abuse and alcohol misuse; (3) prohibit the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession, or use of controlled substances; and (4) to encourage employees to seek professional assistance anytime personal problems, including alcohol or drug dependency, adversely affect their ability to perform their assigned duties.
 - A. The County will endeavor to provide training to employees on the effects and consequences of prohibited drug or alcohol use on personal health, safety and the work environment, and the signs and symptoms which may indicate prohibited drug or alcohol use. The County will schedule mandatory classes but it is ultimately the responsibility of the employee to attend a class provided for by the County.
 - B. All department heads and supervisors designated to determine whether reasonable suspicion exists to require a covered employee to undergo alcohol/drug testing will receive training on the physical, behavioral, speech and performance indicators of probable prohibited drug or alcohol misuse.
- 22.5 Prohibited Substances. "Prohibited substances" addressed by this policy include the following:
 - A. Illegally used controlled substances or drugs. Includes, but is not limited to: marijuana, amphetamines, methamphetamines, opiates, phencyclidine (PCP), and cocaine, as well as drugs not approved for medical use by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration or the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. Illegal use includes use of any illegal drug, misuse

- of legally prescribed drugs, and use of illegally obtained prescription drugs. The collection agency shall adhere to all requirements outlined in 49 CFR, Part 40 DOT Guidelines in determining what constitutes a positive test.
- B. Legal Drugs. The appropriate use of legally prescribed drugs and non-prescription medications is not prohibited. However, the use of any substance which carriers a warning label that indicates that mental functioning, motor skills, or judgment may be adversely affected shall be reported by the employee to the department director and medical advice shall be sought by both the employee and supervisor, as appropriate, before performing safety-sensitive functions. A legally prescribed drug means that an individual has a prescription or other written approval from a healthcare professional for the use of a drug in the course of medical treatment. It must include the patient's name, the name of the substance, quantity/amount to be taken, frequency and the period of authorization. The misuse or abuse of legal drugs while performing official business is prohibited.
- C. Alcohol. The use of beverages or medications containing alcohol, subject to Paragraph 22.6.

22.6 Prohibited Conduct

- A. Manufacture, Trafficking, Possession, and Use. Employees are prohibited from engaging in the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession, or sale of prohibited substances while on duty on County premises, or in County vehicles. Law enforcement shall be notified, as appropriate, where criminal activity is suspected.
- B. Intoxication/Under the Influence. Any employee who fails a drug test or has a breath alcohol concentration of 0.04 or greater shall be removed from their position pending a Loudermill Hearing. An employee with a breath alcohol concentration of 0.02 or greater, but less than 0.04 shall be immediately removed from their position for a minimum of 8 hours, without pay, or until they can pass an alcohol test with a BAC of less than 0.02. If a breath analyzer is unavailable, testing will be conducted via blood test. Disciplinary action will be based on the totality of the circumstances, a BAC of .04 or greater will be subject to termination.
- C. Alcohol Use. No employee should report for duty or remain on duty when his/her ability to perform assigned functions is adversely affected by alcohol or when his/her breath alcohol concentration is 0.02 or greater. No employee shall use alcohol while on duty, or while performing a safety-sensitive function. No employee shall use alcohol within four hours of reporting for duty; or during the hours that they are scheduled on call; or up to eight hours following an accident or until tested; or anytime during a period when that employee may have to perform their functions. Employees, who are not scheduled on call, shall upon being notified to report to duty, acknowledge alcohol use and their inability to perform his/her safety-sensitive function and shall be excused from doing so without further consequences. No employees shall have a breath alcohol concentration of .02 or greater at any time while performing duties for the County. Violation of these provisions is prohibited and punishable by discipline up to and including termination.
- D. Compliance with Testing Requirements. All employees shall be subject to urine and blood drug testing and breath alcohol testing. Refusal to comply with a request for testing, refusal to sign the drug/alcohol testing chain of custody form, inability to provide

sufficient quantities of breath or urine to be tested without a valid medical explanation, tampering with or attempting to adulterate the specimen or collection procedure or not reporting to the collection site in the time allotted is non compliance and shall result in termination.

22.7 Testing Which Results In a Dilute Specimen

- A. Definitions: <u>Dilute Drug Screen</u> Is a drug screen which is identified by the testing lab as an irregular specimen pertaining to the specimen's specific gravity and creatinine concentration. (The irregularity in specific gravity minimizes the reliability of the testing procedure and therefore reduces the reliability in the results.)
- B. Dilute Drug shall be considered a positive test.
- 22.8 Treatment Requirements. All employees are encouraged to make use of the available resources for treatment for alcohol misuse and illegal drug use problems. Under certain circumstances, employees may be required to undergo treatment for substance abuse or alcohol misuse. Any employee who refuses or fails to comply with County of Valencia requirements for treatment, after care, or return to duty will be subject to termination. The cost of any treatment or rehabilitation services will be paid for directly by the employee or their insurance provider. Employees will be allowed to take accumulated sick leave and vacation leave to participate in the prescribed rehabilitation program.
- 22.9 Proper Application of the Policy. The County of Valencia is dedicated to assuring fair and equitable application of this substance abuse policy. Therefore, department heads/supervisors are required to use and apply all aspects of this policy in an unbiased and impartial manner. Any department head/supervisor who knowingly disregards the requirements of this policy, or who is found to deliberately misuse the policy in regard to subordinates, will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination.

22.10 Testing Procedures.

- A. All employees of the County of Valencia shall be subject to drug (urine-blood) and alcohol testing for reasonable suspicion, return to duty, follow-up or random and may be subjected to testing following an accident. Follow-up testing will be conducted for a period of one to five years, with up to six tests performed during the first year and as many as four in subsequent years. The County Human Resources Director may determine the frequency and duration of follow-up testing.
- B. Testing shall be conducted using techniques, equipment and certified laboratory facilities to ensure a high degree of accuracy and reliability. Alcohol testing may occur anytime while performing duties for the County and up to eight hours following an accident. Drug testing may occur any time while performing duties for the County of Valencia and up to 32 hours following an accident.

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- 22.11 Employee Requested Testing. Any employee who questions the result of a required drug test under paragraphs 22.10 through 22-15 of this policy may request that an additional test be conducted. This test will be conducted at a different certified laboratory. The test will be conducted on the split sample that was provided by the employee at the same time as the original sample. The method of collecting, storing, and testing the split sample will be consistent with acceptable testing standards. The employee's request for a split sample test must be made to the Human Resources Director within 72 hours of notice of the original sample verified test result. Requests after 72 hours will only be accepted if the delay was due to documentable facts that were beyond the control of the employee. An employee requested test will be at the expense of the employee.
- 22.12 Reasonable Suspicion Testing. All employees shall be subject to blood, urine and/or breath testing when there is reasonable suspicion to believe the employee is under the influence of prohibited substances. A reasonable suspicion referral for testing will be made on the basis of articulable objective facts and circumstances, which are consistent with the short-term effects of substance abuse. Examples of reasonable suspicion include, but are not limited to the following:
 - A. Physical signs and symptoms consistent with prohibited substance use.
 - B. Evidence of the manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession, or use of controlled substances, drugs, alcohol, or other prohibited substances.
 - C. Occurrence of an accident that may have been caused by use of a prohibited substance or alcohol misuse.
 - D. Fights (to mean physical contact), assaults, and flagrant disregard or violations of established safety, security, or other operating procedures.

22.12.1 Reasonable Suspicion Testing Procedures.

- A. Supervisors who identify an employee that appears to be under the influence of drugs or alcohol in the workplace shall contact the Human Resources Director and complete the Reasonable Suspicion Checklist dated September 26, 2013 (available from HR). The Reasonable Suspicion process involves 3 steps identification, gathering evidence, and testing. The identification phase includes the observation of work performance, behaviors or appearance. For example, the employee may have aggressive behavior, has difficulty walking or is now unable to perform job duties that were properly handled in the past.
- B. The evidence must then be documented. The documentation is the written record that explains what was witnessed and/or the patterns of behavior that indicates someone is impaired. The evidence must be specific, verifiable by independent sources, and concrete. For example, a supervisor may document an unusual number of on-the-job accidents coupled with observations of mood swings that include unpredictable bursts of anger. The documentation should include the names of any witnesses, the time and dates of the occurrences and any other observations that support the Reasonable Suspicion.
- C. The evidence needs to be strictly facts and not opinions, and the facts should focus on safety in the workplace.

- D. Once the facts are documented, they can then be presented to the employee and the employee asked to submit to a drug and alcohol test. At that point the employer would rely on tests like the urine drug test or the breathalyser and Oraline Saliva tests to prove or disprove alcohol and drug use. Human Resources will direct the employee to available testing facilities and either accompany the employee or designate an individual to accompany the employee.
- E. Reasonable Suspicion is not something that can be defined with one list of behaviors or observations because each set of circumstances will be different depending on the workplace and the employee. It does represent a responsibility of the employer in the efforts to keep the workplace safe.
- F. Employees suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol shall not be allowed to drive themselves to a testing facility.
- 22.11 Post-Accident Testing. Any County employee involved in an accident involving County heavy equipment or vehicles will be subject to a drug or alcohol test.
- 22.12 CDL. All employees with a CDL shall comply with Department of Transportation Requirements/Procedure for drug & alcohol testing (Parts 40 and 382).

22.13 Random Testing

- A. Employees in safety-sensitive positions shall be subjected to random, unannounced drug testing. The selection of employees for random drug testing will be made using a scientifically valid method that ensures each covered employee will have an equal chance of being selected each time selections are made. The random tests will be unannounced and spread throughout the year on all days and during all hours of operation.
- B. When an employee is informed of a random drug test they must be tested as soon as is practicably possible but in a time not to exceed 2 hours. All employees who have been randomly selected or are testing in conjunction with Rule 22.23 will be notified, in writing, by the County Manager, a department head or supervisor. All tests will be collected as a split sample giving the employee the opportunity to exercise his/her right to an additional test (Section 22.9) on the sample which was collected. Should the County's agent not collect a split sample, the results of the test, for which a split sample was not collected, will be disregarded by management and the employee will not be required to re-test for this specific testing period.
- C. All employees shall be placed in a selection pool and random drug testing shall come from this predetermined pool. The individual pools shall be defined as follows:
 - 1. Public Works
 - 2. Animal Control
- D. Shift employees, or employees who are not at work on the day of the scheduled test (random or otherwise), and who have been selected for testing, will be required to test

immediately upon their return to work/duty and will be notified and expected to adhere to the rules as described above.

- 22.13 Return-To-Duty Testing. A return-to-duty test is required of an employee who has had a positive drug or alcohol test and must be passed (negative non-dilute) before they can return to a safety-sensitive position. The Human Resources Director must first clear the employee to return-to-regular-duty after the evaluation. The return-to-duty test may be for drugs and/or alcohol as required. Any work missed due to a positive drug/alcohol test or due to treatment shall be charged to the employee's sick leave and/or annual leave (employee's choice) or leave without pay if the employee has no leave balances.
- 22.14 Follow-Up Testing.Once allowed to return to duty, employees shall be subject to unannounced follow-up testing for at least 12 but not to exceed 60 months. The frequency and duration of the follow-up testing may be recommended by the Human Resources Director as long as not more than six tests are preformed during the first 12 months after the employee returns to duty. Follow-up testing is separate from and in addition to the random testing program.
- 22.15 Employment Assessment. The Human Resources Director may refer any employee who tests positive for the presence of illegal drugs or alcohol above the minimum thresholds for evaluation.
- 22.16 Rules for Positive Drug/Alcohol Test

Any employee who has been placed on time for improvement and who tests positive for drugs/alcohol as defined by this policy will be terminated from employment, Section 7.10.

- A. Any covered employee who tests positive for prohibited substances, at or above the minimum threshold, and/or alcohol of 0.04 and above under this policy shall be terminated from employment with the County of Valencia,
- B. Employees shall be terminated upon violation of any of the terms and conditions of the individual's re-entry contract (defined below). An unmonitored dilute, second level shall result in termination of employment

22.17 Re-Entry Contracts

- A. Employees who re-enter the workforce must agree to a re-entry contract. That contract may include, but is not limited to:
 - 1. A release to work statement from the Substance Abuse Professional.
 - 2. A negative test for drugs and/or alcohol. (Section 22.14)
 - 3. An agreement to unannounced frequent follow-up testing for a period of one to five years with up to six tests performed the first year and as many as four in subsequent years (Section 22.15).
 - 4. A statement of expected work-related behaviors.

- 5. An agreement to follow specified after care requirements with the understanding that violation of the re-entry contract is grounds for termination.
- 6. County of Valencia employees shall be terminated upon violation of any of the terms and conditions of the individual's re-entry contract (defined below). An unmonitored dilute, second level shall result in termination of employment.
- 7. Any employee in possession of illegal drugs shall result in termination of employment.
- B. Any safety sensitive employees not covered above shall be terminated upon violation of any of the terms and conditions of the individual's re-entry contract (defined below).
- 22.18 Detection. The County reserves the right to inspect, at any time, all County property and all County vehicles and equipment for the presence of prohibited substances or alcohol. All inspections will be scheduled as deemed necessary by the County Manager or his/her designee or Department Head.
- 22.19 Voluntary Request for Assistance.
 - A. The County of Valencia intends to give the same consideration to persons who voluntarily request assistance (prior to being randomly selected or selected for cause) with chemical dependencies as it does to employees having other diseases.
 - B. Early recognition and treatment of chemical (drug and alcohol) dependency problems is important for successful rehabilitation and reduced personal, family and social disruption. The County supports sound treatment efforts and an employee's job will not be jeopardized for conscientiously seeking assistance prior to random selection or selection for cause. Normal County benefits, such as sick leave and the group medical plan, are available to give help in the rehabilitation process to any employee who voluntarily requests assistance for chemical dependencies.
 - C. Employees who voluntarily request assistance shall be subject to a re-entry contract.

22.20 Records

- A. All records of the controlled substance abuse prevention program must be kept in a secure location with controlled access in the Human Resources Offce Regulation requires that certain records according to their importance be maintained for varying lengths of time, from one (1) to five (5) years.
- B. Records must be kept confidential to the extent permissible by applicable law. These records should not be made a part of a driver's personnel file.
- 22.21 Confidentially. No laboratory reports or test results shall appear in the employment personnel file unless they are a part of a disciplinary action, but shall be placed in a special locked file.

ARTICLE 23: TELEPHONES

Employees shall have telephones at their residences, or cell phones and shall report changes of their telephone numbers or addresses to the Director and Human Resources within two (2) working days after such changes. Telephone and addresses are confidential, and shall not be released to anyone outside of the county without written approval from the concerned employee, or as the result of the issuance of a valid subpoena or other court or administrative order.

ARTICLE 24: OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT

- Outside Employment. Employees may not, directly or indirectly, engage in any outside employment or financial interest which may conflict, in the County's opinion, with the best interests of the County or interfere with the employee's ability to perform his/her assigned County job. Examples include, but are not limited to, outside employment which:
- Prevents the employee from being available for work beyond normal working hours, such as emergencies or peak work periods, when such availability is a regular part of the employee's job;

Is conducted during the employee's work hours;

- 24.1.2. Utilizes County telephones, computers, supplies, or any other resources, facilities or equipment;
- 24.1.3 Constitutes employment, contractual commitment or self-employment which conflicts with Section 24.2, below; or May reasonably be perceived as a conflict of interest, gives the appearance of impropriety or otherwise discredits public service.
- An employee who chooses to have an additional job, contractual commitment or self-employment, may do so provided he/she provides prior notification, on the prescribed form and it is approved County Manager. Any outside employment that could potentially interfere with emergency call-out situations must be reported to the employee's department director. If, after accepting outside employment, situations arise which could interfere with the employee's job, the employee needs to immediately report these situations to the department manager.

ARTICLE 25: ADMINISTRATIVE INVESTIGATIONS

- The Department will investigate alleged or possible employee misconduct to ensure that wrongly accused employees are cleared or any misconduct is accorded appropriate discipline. While endeavoring to protect its employees from spurious and frivolous allegations, the Department will keep confidentiality a priority with respect and concern for those involved.
- 25.2 Retaliation for reporting allegations of staff misconduct is prohibited.
- 25.3 Employees involved in allegations of criminal activity will be referred to a law enforcement agency for investigation and possible prosecution.
- 25.4 To maintain the integrity of the Department, employees are encouraged to report misconduct to the appropriate authority. Disciplinary action may be taken against individuals

intentionally filing false reports. Any employee found to knowingly provide false information or withhold evidence or information pertaining to an investigation shall be subject to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal.

- 25.5 In the event a complainant falsified a statement, the Department shall take whatever action it deems appropriate and the affected employee may pursue whatever legal remedies available.
- 25.6 Investigation
- 25.6.1 Upon determination that an investigation is to be conducted, all evidence shall be collected and preserved, and witnesses, victims, and others who may have information related to the incident or allegations are to be interviewed. Investigations and interviews should be conducted and completed without unreasonable delay.
- 25.6.2 Employee interviews shall be scheduled during normal duty hours or at convenient hours, unless circumstances dictate otherwise. Employees shall be considered on duty in paid status when participating in interviews.
- 25.6.3 Interviews shall be limited in scope to activities, circumstances, events, conduct or acts which are relevant to the incident in question. Nothing in this article shall prohibit questioning about information developed during the course of the investigation. Employees shall be giving reasonable opportunity to obtain union representation if the situation allows for such representation.
- 25.6.4 Interviews may be recorded; recordings shall be preserved and may be used in hearings. Employees will receive a copy of the recording upon request.
- 25.6.5 Interviews will not be unreasonably long in duration. Reasonable respites shall be allowed. Time shall also be provided for personal necessities, meals, telephone calls, and rest periods as may be required by the circumstances.
- 25.6.6 Polygraph examinations may be used as an investigative tool to resolve serious allegations of misconduct in instances where all other reasonable investigative techniques have been exhausted and are deemed impractical or ineffective.
- 25.6.7 If deemed necessary, an employee may be required to submit to a polygraph examination. If the employee refuses to comply, the employee may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal.
- 25.6.8 During a polygraph examination, the employee shall not be entitled to an employee representative present in the examination room.
- 25.6.9 Polygraph examiners shall be qualified pursuant to NMRA 11-707 (B) (2012).

ARTICLE 26: ISSUED EQUIPMENT

- 26.1 Employees have a duty to exercise reasonable care in utilizing any equipment issued to them.
- Any employee who negligently or intentionally damages or loses any equipment issued to them shall be required to pay for the costs of repair or replacement.
- 26.3.1. However, the Department recognizes that equipment may become lost, broken or inoperable due to ordinary wear and tear or through no fault of the employee.
- 26.4 If equipment is broken or becomes inoperable due to ordinary wear and tear or through no fault of the employee the Department agrees to replace such equipment within the Department's budget.
- 26.5 The County agrees to furnish all required personal protective equipment. A list of such items may be kept current in the Department Policy and Procedure. The employee shall be responsible for normal care and maintenance of all issued equipment.
- An employee leaving the service of the County whether through resignation, retirement, layoff or discharge is responsible for returning any County property that he/she may have in his possession, including but not limited to cloth badges.
- All Equipment shall be returned within 5 working days of the last date of employment.
- 26.8 If an employee fails to return issued equipment, the County shall be permitted to offset the cost of such equipment against any compensation for annual leave accruals that would be paid at the time of separation of employment.

ARTICLE 27: NEPOTISM

- 27.1 Nepotism. In order to avoid the practice or appearance of nepotism in employment, the following situations will be avoided without exception:
- 27.2 Near-relatives shall not work in the department when there is a supervisory relationship between them.
- 27.2.1 Near-Relative. For purposes of this Rule, near-relative means anyone related to another employee or his/her spouse/domestic partner within the second degree of consanguinity.

First degree includes father, mother, son, daughter, brother, sister, and spouse.

Second degree includes grandparents, grandchildren, uncle, aunt, first cousin, nephew, and niece.

Third degree includes great grandparents, great grandchildren, great uncle, great aunt, children of great uncle or aunt, second cousin, children of first cousin, grand nephew and grandniece.

- 27.3 When there is a change in assignment or relationships among employees, which lead to the supervision of or by other near-relatives, the employee must inform the elected official or department director in writing within five (5) working days. The elected official and department director subject to the approval of the County Manager will decide on a course of action and advise the affected employees within five (5) working days.
- 27.4 Any problem arising from such a situation should be referred to the County Manager.

ARTICLE 28: PARTIAL INVALIDITY, SEPARABILITY, AND WAIVER

- This Agreement shall be effective upon ratification and execution by AFSCME Council 18, Local 1382 and the Board of County Commissioners. The term of this agreement shall be for 3 years.
- 28.2 Should neither either party to this Agreement request the opening of negotiations, at least one hundred twenty (120) days prior to the expiration of this agreement or each year thereafter this Agreement shall continue in full force.
- 28.2.1 This contract may not be re-opened prior to its expiration date unless both parties mutually agree to the re-opener, however this contract may be re-opened by the request of either party for economic and two other items annually if a request is made to the other party 30 days before June 30th of each year.
- 28.2.2 In addition re-opener listed above contract will have a reopener for economics in January 15, 2014.
- 28.3 In the event that any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be declared by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect the remaining provisions thereof. In such event, the parties shall immediately meet to negotiate a suitable provision to replace the invalid or unenforceable provision.
- This Agreement is the only Agreement between the parties and supersedes any and all previous agreements and understandings.
- Should applicable law or circumstances render invalid, unenforceable or no longer appropriate any provision of this Agreement, the parties shall meet to negotiate a suitable provision to replace the invalid or unenforceable provision. Such replacement provisions shall become effective immediately upon ratification according to the respective procedures and regulations of the parties, and shall remain in effect for the duration of the Agreement.
- 28.6 In the event that an ambiguity exists with respect to, any provision of this Agreement, the parties may meet to negotiate a Memorandum of Understanding with respect to the affected provision, as well as any other provision whose interpretation or implementation is dependent or contingent thereon. Such Memorandum of Understanding shall be executed by

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appropriate representatives of the parties and shall remain in effect for the duration of the Agreement.

- This Agreement specifically describes the entire Agreement between the parties. In applying this Agreement, the parties agree that state and/or federal laws and regulations enacted shall take precedence over this Agreement and any Department Standard Operating Procedures (S.O.P.). Provided, this Agreement shall take precedence over any conflicting Department Policies or S.O.P.s.
- 28.8 The Union and the County, for the duration of this Agreement, each voluntarily and unqualifiedly waives the right, and each agrees that the other shall not be obligated, to bargain collectively with respect to any subject matter or matter referred to or covered by this Agreement, except where it has specifically be agreed to do so in the agreement.
- 28.9 The parties acknowledge that, during the negotiations which resulted in this Agreement, each had the unlimited right and opportunity to make demands and proposals with respect to any subject or matter not removed by law from the area of collective bargaining and that the understandings and agreement arrived at by the parties after the exercise of that right and opportunity.
